**The Central Institutions (Scotland) Amendment
Regulations 1976**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by sections 76(1) and 81(1) and (4) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1962(a) as said section 81 is set out in section 15 of the Education (Scotland) Act 1969(b) and of section 144(1) and (5) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1962 and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, and being of the opinion mentioned in regulation 5 of these regulations, I hereby make the following regulations:—

Citation, construction and commencement

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the Central Institutions (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1976, shall be construed as one with the Central Institutions (Scotland) Regulations 1972(c), with the Central Institutions (Scotland) Regulations 1974(d), with the Central Institutions (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1974(e) and with the Central Institutions (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1975(f) and shall come into operation on 19th February 1976.

Interpretation

2.—(1) In these regulations the expression “the principal regulations” means the Central Institutions (Scotland) Regulations 1974 as amended by the Central Institutions (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1974 and the Central Institutions (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1975.

(2) In these regulations any reference to any enactment or scheme shall be construed as a reference to that enactment or scheme as amended or extended and as including a reference thereto as applied by or under any other enactment or scheme.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889(g) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Duncan of Jordanstone College of Art

3. The Duncan of Jordanstone College of Art Scheme 1975(h) shall be amended as follows:

(i) for sub-paragraph 3(b) of paragraph 4 there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:—

“(b) 2 persons appointed by the Regional Council of Tayside;”;

- (ii) for sub-paragraphs (1) and (2) of paragraph 35 there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraphs:—

“(1) The governing body shall appoint a principal and, where appropriate, a vice-principal of the College and such other members of staff as they may require.

(2) The governing body may delegate to a committee appointed by the Academic Council and consisting wholly of academic staff such powers with regard to the appointment of academic staff below the level of head of department as the governing body think fit.”;

- (iii) in sub-paragraph 2(b)(i) of paragraph 43 the words “ex officio” shall be inserted after the word “College”;

- (iv) for sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 43 there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:—

“(3) The governing body acting jointly with the governing body of the College of Technology shall determine the periods of office, not exceeding 4 years, of the appointed members of the Joint Standing Committee. The appointed members of the said Committee shall be eligible for reappointment after the lapse of such period of time, not being less than 1 year, following the expiry of a period of office as may be determined by the governing body.”.

Dundee College of Technology

4. The Dundee College of Technology Scheme 1975(a) shall be amended as follows:

- (i) for sub-paragraph 3(b) of paragraph 4 there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:—

“(b) 2 persons appointed by the Regional Council of Tayside;”;

- (ii) for sub-paragraphs (1) and (2) of paragraph 35 there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:—

“(1) The governing body shall appoint a principal and, where appropriate, a vice-principal of the College and such other members of staff as they may require.

(2) The governing body may delegate to a committee appointed by the Academic Council and consisting wholly of academic staff such powers with regard to the appointment of academic staff below the level of head of department as the governing body think fit.”;

- (iii) in sub-paragraph 2(b)(i) of paragraph 45 the words “ex officio” shall be inserted after the word “College”;

- (iv) for sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 45 there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph:—

“(3) The governing body acting jointly with the governing body of the College of Art shall determine the periods of office, not exceeding 4 years, of the appointed members of the Joint Standing Committee. The appointed members of the said Committee shall be eligible for reappointment after the lapse of such period of time, not being less than 1 year, following the expiry of a period of office as may be determined by the governing body.”.

Revocations of instruments

5. The Articles of Association specified in column (1) of the Schedule to these regulations are hereby revoked to the extent (being the extent to which the provisions of such Articles of Association are in the opinion of the Secretary of State inconsistent with the principal regulations) specified opposite such Articles of Association in column (2) of that Schedule.

Savings

6.—(1) The provision of any instrument relating to any of the Central Institutions specified in these regulations and in force immediately before the date of coming into operation of these regulations shall, except as otherwise expressly varied or revoked by these regulations, continue in force after the said date as if these regulations had not been made.

(2) Section 38(2) of the Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply as if these regulations were an Act of Parliament and as if any provision of any instrument hereby revoked by these regulations were an Act of Parliament repealed by an Act of Parliament.

REVOCATIONS OF THE PROVISIONS OF INSTRUMENTS

Instrument Column (1)	Extent of Revocation Column (2)
Articles of Association of the Scottish College of Textiles dated 26th October 1922 as amended by Special Resolutions passed on 27th December 1949 and 27th December 1967 and by the principal regulations.	In Article 65 the words “, one of whom shall be the person appointed by the County of Selkirk. The remaining Members of the Executive shall be appointed by the Governors” shall be deleted.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Duncan of Jordanstone College of Art Scheme 1975 and the Dundee College of Technology Scheme 1975 by increasing from one to two the number of persons who may be appointed to the governing body of each of those colleges by the Tayside Regional Council. They also make certain other minor amendments relating to the administration of the colleges.

The Regulations also revoke a provision in the Articles of Association of the Scottish College of Textiles which is, in the opinion of the Secretary of State, inconsistent with the Central Institutions (Scotland) Regulations 1974 as amended.

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
