The Milk (Special Designations) (Specified Areas) (Scotland) Order 1977

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 5 of the Milk (Special Designations) Act 1949(a), and now vested in me(b), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, having consulted such representative organisations as appear to me substantially to represent the interests concerned with the purposes of this order, I hereby make the following order, a draft whereof was laid before Parliament in accordance with section 5(3) of the said Act:—

1. This order may be cited as the Milk (Special Designations) (Specified Areas) (Scotland) Order 1977 and shall come into operation on 1st August 1977.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. Section 1(1) of the Milk (Special Designations) Act 1949 shall come into operation in the area specified in the Schedule to this order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

Section 5 of the Milk (Special Designations) Act 1949, as read with the Transfer of Functions (Ministry of Food) Order 1955, enables the Secretary of State, after consulting such representative organisations as appear to him substantially to represent the interests concerned, to order that Section 1(1) of the 1949 Act, which requires the use of a special designation for retail sales of milk, shall come into operation in any area of Scotland in which it is not then in operation.

Representative organisations have been consulted and this Order, a draft of which was laid before Parliament as required by the 1949 Act, extends the operation of the provisions of Section 1(1) of the Act to those areas of Scotland which have not previously been specified.
