The Extradition (Hijacking) (Amendment) Order 1977

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 26th day of July 1977

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas extradition treaties have come into force between the United Kingdom and Finland and between the United Kingdom and the United States of America which replace the treaties with these States specified in Schedule 2 to the Extradition (Hijacking) Order 1971(a) as amended by the Extradition (Hijacking) (Amendment) Order 1972(b):

And Whereas other States have become parties to the Convention for the Suppression of Unlawful Seizure of Aircraft signed at The Hague on 16th December 1970(c) requiring the further amendment of Schedules 2 and 3 to the Extradition (Hijacking) Order 1971:

And Whereas it is expedient that the amendments to Schedules 2 and 3 to the above-mentioned Order as specified in subsequent amending Orders(d) should be consolidated:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by sections 2, 17 and 21 of the Extradition Act 1870(e) and sections 3(2), 6(1) and 6(3) of the Hijacking Act 1971(f), or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Extradition (Hijacking) (Amendment) Order 1977 and shall come into operation on 1st September 1977.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(g) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The Extradition (Hijacking) Order 1971 shall be amended by substituting in place of the entries in Schedule 2 (which names the foreign States with which the United Kingdom has extradition treaties in force and which are parties to the Convention for the Suppression of Unlawful Seizure of Aircraft signed at The Hague on 16th December 1970) the entries specified in Schedule 1 hereto.

4. The Extradition (Hijacking) Order 1971 shall be amended by substituting in place of the entries in Part I of Schedule 3 (which names the foreign States with which the United Kingdom has no extradition treaties in force and which are parties to the Convention for the Suppression of Unlawful Seizure of Aircraft signed at The Hague on 16th December 1970) the entries specified in Schedule 2 hereto.

5. The following Orders in Council are hereby revoked:—
