## The Extradition (Tokyo Convention) (Amendment) Order 1977

Made - - - - 26th July 1977

Laid before Parliament 3rd August 1977

Coming into Operation 1st September 1977

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 26th day of July 1977

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas extradition treaties have come into force between the United Kingdom and Finland and between the United Kingdom and the United States of America which replace the treaties with those States specified in Schedule 1 to the Extradition (Tokyo Convention) Order 1971(a):

And Whereas other States have become parties to the Convention on Offences and certain other Acts Committed on board Aircraft signed at Tokyo on 14th September 1963(b) requiring the further amendment of the above Order:

And Whereas it is expedient that the amendments to Schedule 1 to the above-mentioned Order as specified in subsequent amending Orders(c) should be consolidated:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by sections 2, 17 and 21 of the Extradition Act 1870(d) and section 2(2) of the Tokyo Convention Act 1967(e), or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Extradition (Tokyo Convention) (Amendment) Order 1977 and shall come into operation on 1st September 1977.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(f) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The Extradition (Tokyo Convention) Order 1971 shall be amended by substituting in place of the entries in Schedule 1 (which names the States with which the United Kingdom has extradition treaties in force and which are parties to the Convention on Offences and certain other Acts Committed on

board Aircraft signed at Tokyo on 14th September 1963) the entries specified in Schedule 1 hereto.

4. The Extradition (Tokyo Convention) Order 1971 shall be further amended by substituting in place of the entries in Schedule 2 (which names the territories to which the application of the Tokyo Convention is extended) the entries specified in Schedule 2 hereto.

5. The Extradition (Tokyo Convention) (Amendment) Order 1972 and the Extradition (Tokyo Convention) (Amendment) Order 1973 are hereby revoked.
