Diseases of Fish (Infected Area) (Scotland) No. 2 Order 1977

Made - - - 9th December 1977 Coming into Operation 14th December 1977

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2(1) as read with section 11 of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf and having been satisfied as respects the area hereinafter mentioned that certain waters therein are infected waters, hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and Commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Diseases of Fish (Infected Area) (Scotland) No. 2 Order 1977 and shall come into operation on 14th December 1977.

Interpretation

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Infected Area

3. The area comprising that part of Loch Etive, Argyll, lying to the southeast of a straight line drawn between a point on the headland of the bay to the south of Aird's Point, Ordnance Survey grid reference NM 985 341 and a point on the headland RUBHA RIABHACH, Ordnance Survey grid reference NM 974 338 up to the High Water Mark of Ordinary Spring Tides but excluding that area as defined in Diseases of Fish (Infected Area) (Scotland) No. 4 Order 1975 is hereby declared to be an infected area for the purposes of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937.

Control of movement of fish, etc.

4. No person shall without previous consent in writing of the Secretary of State move out of the area declared by Article 3 above to be an infected area any live fish or eggs of fish or food stuff for fish.
