The Glasgow-Greenock-Monkton Trunk Road (Hillington-West Ferry) (Detrunking) Order 1977

Made -Coming into Operation 26th May 1977

1st July 1977

The Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 1(2) of the Trunk Roads Act 1946(a), as read with the Transfer of Functions (Roads, Bridges and Ferries) Order 1955(b), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and having complied with the provisions of Schedule 2 to the said Act of 1946 as amended by section 51 of and Schedule 1 to the Roads (Scotland) Act 1970(c), hereby makes the following order:—

- 1. This order may be cited as the Glasgow-Greenock-Monkton Trunk Road (Hillington-West Ferry) (Detrunking) Order 1977, and shall come into operation on 1st July 1977.
- 2. The Interpretation Act 1889(d), shall apply for this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. On the date of coming into operation of this order, the length of road described in the Schedule to this order shall cease to be a trunk road.
