The Scotland Act 1978 (Referendum) Order 1978*Laid before Parliament in draft**Made - - - - 20th December 1978**Coming into Operation 20th December 1978*

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 20th day of December 1978

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a draft of this Order has been laid before Parliament and approved by resolution of each House:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by paragraphs 1 and 4 of Schedule 17 to the Scotland Act 1978(a), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Citation and Operation

1. This Order may be cited as the Scotland Act 1978 (Referendum) Order 1978 and shall come into operation forthwith.

Interpretation

2.—(1) Unless the contrary intention appears, in this Order, and in any provision applied by this Order:—

the “Act of 1949” means the Representation of the People Act 1949(b);

the “Act of 1969” means the Representation of the People Act 1969(c);

the “Act of 1977” means the Returning Officers (Scotland) Act 1977(d);

“Chief Counting Officer” means the person appointed as such under paragraph 7 of Schedule 17 to the Scotland Act 1978;

“counting officer” means any person appointed by the Chief Counting Officer under paragraph 7 of Schedule 17 to the Scotland Act 1978 as counting officer for a region or islands area in Scotland and includes the Chief Counting Officer;

“elector” means a person who is entitled under paragraph 2 of Schedule 17 to the Scotland Act 1978 to vote in the referendum;

“observer” means a person appointed in accordance with Article 5;

“referendum” means the referendum to be held under section 85 of, and Schedule 17 to, the Scotland Act 1978;

“register” means a register of parliamentary or, in the case of peers, local government electors prepared under the Act of 1949 for use at parliamentary or local government elections after 15th February 1979 and before 16th February 1980, and

“registered” in relation to an elector, means a person registered on a register;

“registration officer” has the same meaning as in the Act of 1949;

“Regulations of 1961” means the Town and Country Planning (Control of Advertisements) (Scotland) Regulations 1961(a);

“Regulations of 1975” means the Representation of the People (Scotland) Regulations 1975(b);

“returning officer” means a person discharging the functions conferred on him in relation to the referendum by paragraph 6 of Schedule 17 to the Scotland Act 1978;

and any other expression which is used in this Order and which is also used in the Act of 1949 or in the Act of 1969 shall have the same meaning in this Order as it has in such Act.

(2) Without prejudice to Article 3(4), a reference in this Order to an enactment or instrument made under an enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment or instrument as amended by any enactment or instrument.

(3) Unless the contrary intention appears, a reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to an Article in or Schedule to this Order.

(4) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Application of certain statutory provisions to the referendum

3.—(1) The provisions of the Act of 1949, of the Act of 1969 and of the Act of 1977 specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 shall, subject to the modifications or exceptions (if any) specified in relation to those provisions in column 2 of that Schedule, apply in connection with the referendum.

(2) The provisions of the Regulations of 1961 and of the Regulations of 1975 specified in column 1 of Schedule 2 shall, subject to the modifications or exceptions (if any) specified in relation to those provisions in column 2 of that Schedule, apply in connection with the referendum.

(3) Unless the contrary intention appears, in the provisions applied by Schedules 1 and 2:—

(a) any reference to an election, parliamentary election or general election shall be construed as a reference to the referendum;

(b) any reference to a constituency shall be construed as a reference to the area for which a returning officer acts;

(c) any reference to a local government election, candidate, nomination, election agent, polling agent, counting agent or election court and any provision relating solely to England and Wales or Northern Ireland shall be disregarded.

(4) Unless the contrary intention appears, in the provisions applied by Schedules 1 and 2, any reference to an enactment or instrument made under an enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment or instrument as amended by any enactment or instrument and as applied and modified by this Order.

The polling day and hours

4.—(1) The referendum shall be held on 1st March 1979.

(2) The hours of polling shall be between 7 a.m. and 10 p.m. on the day of the referendum.

Observers

5.—(1) The Secretary of State may make arrangements for the appointment of persons to observe the counting of the votes, including the verification of the ballot paper accounts.

(2) Any such appointment shall be in writing and shall be signed by the person appointing.

Voting by post or by proxy

6.—(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (5) of this Article, an application to be treated as an absent voter, an application for the appointment of a proxy or an application by a proxy to vote by post which:—

(a) the registration officer has allowed for an indefinite period for use in parliamentary and local government elections (or, in the case of a peer, local government elections only), and

(b) remains in force on 15th February 1979,

shall be deemed to have been allowed for the purposes of the referendum; and sections 12, 13, 14 and 15 (or, in the case of a peer, section 25) and section 41 of the Act of 1949, sections 1(3), 5 and 6(3) of the Act of 1969 and Regulations 28 to 33 (inclusive) and Regulation 35 of the Regulations of 1975 shall apply accordingly.

(2) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (5) of this Article, a person may apply to be treated as an absent voter at the referendum for any of the reasons envisaged in paragraphs (a) to (d) inclusive of Form S (Application to be treated as an absent voter for a particular election) in the Schedule to the Regulations of 1975; and the said form, together with paragraphs (1)(a), (2)(a) and (3) of Regulation 28 and Regulation 35 of those Regulations, sections 12, 13, 14 and 15 (or, in the case of a peer, section 25) and section 41 of the Act of 1949 and sections 1(3), 5 and 6(3) of the Act of 1969, shall be deemed to have effect for this purpose.

(3) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (5) of this Article, a person who has applied to be treated as an absent voter at the referendum on the grounds of his service in one of Her Majesty's reserve or auxiliary forces may apply for the appointment of a proxy; and Form D (Proxy paper) and Form U (Application for appointment of proxy) in the Schedule to the Regulations of 1975, together with paragraphs (1) and (3) of Regulation 30 of those Regulations, sections 12(3), 14 and 15 (or, in the case of a peer, section 25) and section 41 of the Act of 1949 and sections 1(3), 5 and 6(3) of the Act of 1969 shall be deemed to have effect for this purpose.

(4) Articles 3(3) and 3(4) shall apply for the purposes of the provisions applied by this Article as they apply to the provisions applied by Schedules 1 and 2.

(5) Any application to which this Article applies, any application to be no longer treated as an absent voter or any notice cancelling the appointment of a proxy shall be disregarded by the registration officer if it is received by him after 15th February 1979:

Provided that an application to be treated as an absent voter on the grounds of employment on the day of the poll by a returning officer or as a constable may be allowed after that date.

Expenses of returning officers

7. The expenses to which a returning officer is entitled as the expenses which he has incurred for the purposes of or in connection with the referendum shall be defrayed as administrative expenses of the Secretary of State.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order makes provision with respect to the conduct of the referendum to be held in Scotland under the Scotland Act 1978 and specifies the date on which the poll is to be held. It provides that applications to vote by post or by proxy at a parliamentary or, in the case of a peer, a local government election shall apply for the purposes of the referendum and provides for the appointment of observers at the count. It also provides for the expenses of returning officers to be defrayed as administrative expenses of the Secretary of State.

Schedules 1 and 2 specify the provisions of the Representation of the People Acts, the Returning Officers (Scotland) Act 1977 and subordinate legislation which apply to the referendum, together with appropriate modifications. The modifications take account in particular of the absence in relation to the referendum of candidates and their election, polling and counting agents.

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
