The Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants)**Order 1978**

Made - - - - 11th January 1978

Coming into Operation 31st January 1978

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, as respects England and Wales, and the Secretary of State, as respects Scotland, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1(1), 20(viii) and (ix) and 85(1) of the Diseases of Animals Act 1950(a), in so far as those powers are now vested in them severally(b), and the said Minister and the Secretary of State, acting jointly, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1(1), 11(vi) and (vii), 20(viii) and (ix), 50(1) and 85(1) of the said Act of 1950, in so far as those powers are now vested in them jointly(c), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

Citation, extent and commencement

1. This order, which may be cited as the Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) Order 1978, shall apply to Great Britain and shall come into operation on 31st January 1978.

Interpretation

2.—(1) In this order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“the Act” means the Diseases of Animals Act 1950 as amended or extended by any other enactment;

“approved disinfectant” has the meaning assigned to that expression in Article 4;

“dilution rate” means the number of parts of water with which one part of an approved disinfectant is to be diluted;

“Foot-and-Mouth Disease Orders” means the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order of 1928(d), as amended(e), and the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1938(f), as amended(g);

“Fowl Pest Orders” means the Fowl Pest Order of 1936(h), as amended(i), and the Fowl Pest (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order 1956(j), as amended(k);

“general order” has the meaning assigned to that expression in Article 3(3);

“inspector” means a person appointed to be an inspector for the purposes of the Act by the Minister or a local authority and, when used in relation to an officer of the Minister, includes a veterinary inspector;

“the Minister” means the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State acting jointly;

“special disease order” means one of the orders mentioned in Article 3(1);

“Swine Vesicular Disease Order” means the Swine Vesicular Disease Order 1972(a), as amended(b);

“Tuberculosis Orders” means the Tuberculosis Order 1964(c), as amended(d), and the Tuberculosis (Scotland) Order 1964(e), as amended(f).

(2) Any reference in this order—

(a) to any order shall be construed as a reference to that order as from time to time amended or extended, and as including a reference to any order which may replace it, and

(b) to a numbered article or schedule is a reference to the article or schedule so numbered in this order.

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889(g) applies for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if this order and the orders hereby revoked were Acts of Parliament.

Special disease and general orders

3.—(1) For the purposes of this order the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Orders, the Fowl Pest Orders, the Tuberculosis Orders and the Swine Vesicular Disease Order are special disease orders.

(2) Any reference in a special disease order to a disinfectant or an approved disinfectant shall be construed as a reference to any disinfectant for the time being listed as approved in Schedule 1 or Schedule 2 for use under that order.

(3) For the purposes of this order a general order is an order made under the Act by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food or by the Secretary of State or by the said Minister and the Secretary of State acting jointly (other than this order or a special disease order), or regulations of a local authority made thereunder, in which there is a requirement for disinfection.

(4) Any reference in any general order to a disinfectant or an approved disinfectant shall be construed as a reference to a disinfectant for the time being listed in Schedule 1 or Schedule 2 as approved for use under general orders.

4. A disinfectant listed in column 1 of either Schedule 1 or Schedule 2 is an approved disinfectant.

Disinfectants listed in Schedule 1

5.—(1) A disinfectant listed in column 1 of Schedule 1 is approved for use, and may be used, only under and for the purposes of an order in the column relating to which in that Schedule a dilution rate is specified opposite the name of that disinfectant and, subject to the provisions of Article 8, may be used under such an order only at the dilution rate so specified.

(2) No disinfectant shall be added to those listed in column 1 of Schedule 1 unless it has been approved by the Minister under and in accordance with the provisions of Article 7.

(3) A disinfectant listed in column 1 of Schedule 1 shall remain an approved disinfectant until it is deleted therefrom by order of the Minister, unless it is then added to the disinfectants listed in column 1 of Schedule 2.

Disinfectants listed in Schedule 2

6.—(1) A disinfectant listed in column 1 of Schedule 2 is approved for use, and may be used, only under and for the purposes of an order in the column relating to which in that Schedule a dilution rate is specified opposite the name of that disinfectant, and may, subject to the provisions of Article 8, be used under such an order only at the dilution rate so specified.

(2) A disinfectant listed in column 1 of Schedule 2 shall remain an approved disinfectant until 30th June 1978.

Testing and approval of disinfectants

7.—(1) The Minister may test any disinfectant submitted to him by any person for the purpose of having such disinfectant approved, and listed as approved in Schedule 1, in respect of—

- (a) the identity and amount of its active ingredients and, when diluted, the corrosive effect and physical stability of such disinfectant; and
- (b) the efficacy of such disinfectant for use under the provisions of any special disease order or general order in respect of which approval of the disinfectant is sought;

and shall in accordance with the result of such tests grant or refuse approval of the disinfectant submitted.

(2) For the purpose of conducting the tests specified in paragraph (1) of this Article, the Minister may require such samples as he considers necessary of any disinfectant submitted to him, and of its ingredients, to be supplied by the person submitting the disinfectant, together with such information concerning the said disinfectant and its ingredients as the Minister may require, and an application for the listing of any disinfectant as approved shall be made in a form prescribed by the Minister.

(3) The Minister may at any time test a sample of an approved disinfectant obtained by him in respect of any of the matters specified in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of paragraph (1) above.

(4) If a sample of an approved disinfectant subjected to tests under paragraph (3) above does not in respect of any matter specified in sub-paragraphs (a) or (b) of paragraph (1) above meet his requirements, the Minister may delete that disinfectant from the Schedule in which it is listed, but shall not so delete it without affording its manufacturer an opportunity to make representations, orally or in writing or both, against its deletion.

Application of Approved Disinfectants

8.—(1) An inspector may, in respect of any act of disinfection required to be carried out under any special disease order or any general order, by notice served on the person by whom disinfection is to be carried out, specify the mode of disinfection to be adopted, including in particular the dilution rate at which the approved disinfectant is to be applied.

(2) The requirements contained in any such notice shall (except where the notice otherwise provides) be in addition to and not in derogation of the requirements of this order or of the orders referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article.

(3) Failure by a person on whom any such notice is served to comply with the requirements thereof shall be an offence against the Act.

Marking

9. Every container in which an approved disinfectant is offered or exposed for sale, or a label securely affixed thereto, shall be clearly and legibly marked with—

- (a) a statement that it contains an approved disinfectant;
- (b) if the approved disinfectant is approved for use under a special disease order, the name of the special disease order for the purposes of which the use of the approved disinfectant is approved, and the dilution rate at which its use under that order is approved;
- (c) if the approved disinfectant is approved for use under general orders, a statement that the use of the approved disinfectant is approved for the purposes of general orders made under the Act, and a statement of the dilution rate at which its use under general orders is approved;
- (d) a statement that the approved disinfectant is of the same quality and composition as the sample submitted to the Minister on which the disinfectant's approval was based; and
- (e) such warning notices as the Minister may require.

Sampling of Disinfectants

10. Where under any special disease order or general order the use of a disinfectant or of an approved disinfectant is required, the person using the disinfectant shall if so required by an inspector, furnish him with a sample of the disinfectant used, or permit him to take such a sample, and also furnish the inspector with all such particulars as may be reasonably required as to the name and composition of the disinfectant used.

Offences

11. Any person who—

- (a) falsely marks, or causes or permits to be falsely marked, a container of disinfectant or a label affixed thereto with any of the statements specified in Article 9, or
 - (b) sells or offers or exposes for sale, any container of disinfectant so falsely marked, or bearing a label so falsely marked,
- commits an offence against the Act.

Revocation

12. The Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) Order 1972(a), the Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) (Amendment) Order 1974(b), the Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) (Amendment) Order 1975(c), the Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 1975(d), the Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) (Amendment) Order 1976(e), the Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 1976(f), the Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) (Amendment) Order 1977(g), and the Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 1977(h), are hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order revokes and replaces the Diseases of Animals (Approved Disinfectants) Order 1972, as amended.

The Order specifies in Schedule 1 the disinfectants approved for use for the purposes of, respectively, the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Orders, the Fowl Pest Orders, the Tuberculosis Orders or the Swine Vesicular Disease Order, all made under the Diseases of Animals Act 1950, or for use under general orders made under that Act in which there is a requirement for disinfection.

Schedule 2 lists certain disinfectants approved for use for a transitional period only.

The Order also provides for the testing of disinfectants for approval and for the marking of disinfectant containers; gives power to inspectors to take samples of disinfectants and by notice to require a particular method of disinfection; and makes the false marking of a disinfectant container or the selling of a falsely marked container an offence against the 1950 Act.
