Made - - - - - *26th November 1979*

Laid before Parliament *10th December 1979*

Coming into Operation *1st January 1980*

The Industrial Assurance Commissioner, with the approval of the Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 43 of the Industrial Assurance Act 1923(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Industrial Assurance (Fees) Regulations 1979 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1980.
2. In the Regulations “the Act” means the Industrial Assurance Act 1923.
3. The fees set out in the Schedule hereto shall be payable in respect of the matters set out therein.
4. The Industrial Assurance (Fees) Regulations 1976(b) are hereby revoked.

On every application for a certificate under section 1(2)(d) of the Act, for each class of assurances to which the application relates	76
On every application or request for further postponement of time under section 7(1)(c) of the Act	25
On every award of dissolution of a society	13
On every direction for division or appropriation of the assets of a society:—	
where the value of the assets is less than £300, 12% of that value;	
where the value of the assets is £300 or more, £38, with an additional £3 for every £100 or part thereof in excess of £300.	
On every application for a certificate of exemption under section 10 of the Act	30
On every reference of a dispute under section 32(1) of the Act for every £20 (or part of £20) claimed	1
up to a maximum fee of £25.	
where the dispute relates to the rights of the parties without involving any pecuniary claim	2
On every application under section 32(2) of the Act for every £1 or part of £1 awarded to be paid	0.06
On every application for sanction to an amalgamation or transfer of engagements under section 36 of the Act	76
and in addition for every day or part of a day occupied in hearing representations	12
For every inspection on the same day of documents in the custody of the Commissioner relating to one and the same society or company	1
For a copy or extract of any document in the custody of the Commissioner not exceeding 216 words, £2 and, if exceeding that number, 46p per folio of 72 words; provided that where a photocopy is supplied the fee charged therefor may be of an amount less than the fee payable on the basis of word content.	
For any document certified as a true copy of a document in the custody of the Commissioner	3
and in addition, where the copy so certified is not made by the Commissioner and does not exceed 216 words, 90p for the examination of such copy and for every additional folio of 72 words 18p.	

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations increase the fees payable in connection with the exercise by the Industrial Assurance Commissioner of his functions under the Industrial Assurance Act 1923, except in relation to disputes, where the fees payable remain unchanged. They supersede the Industrial Assurance (Fees) Regulations 1976.
