**The Liverpool-Warrington-Stockport-Sheffield-Lincoln-Skegness
Trunk Road (from the Liverpool City Boundary to the Merseyside
County Boundary) (Detrunking) Order 1979**

Made - - - - 7th December 1979

Coming into Operation 1st January 1980

The Minister of Transport makes this Order in exercise of powers conferred by section 7 of the Highways Act 1959(a), section 27 of the Local Government Act 1966(b) and now vested in him(c), and of all other enabling powers:—

1. The length of trunk road described in the schedule to this Order and shown by broad striped hatching on the deposited plan shall cease to be a trunk road and shall be classified as a principal road as from the date on which the Order comes into operation.

2. In this Order:—

“the deposited plan” means the plan numbered NWRT 5036/80/3 marked “The Liverpool-Warrington-Stockport-Sheffield-Lincoln-Skegness Trunk Road (from the Liverpool City Boundary to the Merseyside County Boundary) (Detrunking) Order 1979” signed by authority of the Minister and deposited at the Department of Transport, Becket House, Lambeth Palace Road, London SE1 7ER, where it may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours;

“principal road” as a classification for a highway, means that the highway is a principal road for the purposes of enactments and instruments which refer to highways classified as principal roads and is also classified for the purpose of every other enactment and instrument which refers to highways classified by the Minister;

“the Trunk Road” means the Liverpool-Warrington-Stockport-Sheffield-Lincoln-Skegness Trunk Road (A57).

3. This Order shall come into operation on 1st January 1980 and may be cited as the Liverpool-Warrington-Stockport-Sheffield-Lincoln-Skegness Trunk

SCHEDULE

LENGTH OF TRUNK ROAD CEASING TO BE A TRUNK ROAD

That length of the A57 which extends from the Liverpool City Boundary at a point 5 yards west of its junction with Dinas Lane, Huyton to the Merseyside County Boundary at Bold Heath, Bold, inclusive of its roundabout junction with the B5194 Prescot; its roundabout junction with the A58/B5199 Prescot; and its roundabout interchange junction with the M62 Motorway, Rainhill Stoops; having an approximate length of 9.05 miles (measured along the route of the trunk road) and known locally as Liverpool Road, Huyton; Derby Street, Prescot; and Warrington Road, Whiston all in the Borough of Knowsley; Warrington Road, Rainhill and Warrington Road, Bold Heath, Bold in the Borough of St. Helens.
