**The Welsh Water Authority (Cwmystradllyn  
Reservoir Discharge) Order 1979**

*Made* - - - - 18th December 1979

*Laid before Parliament* 14th January 1980

*Coming into Operation* 5th February 1980

The Secretary of State for Wales, in exercise of powers conferred on him by section 1 of the Water Resources Act 1971(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. This order may be cited as the Welsh Water Authority (Cwmystradllyn Reservoir Discharge) Order 1979, and shall come into operation on 5th February 1980. Citation and commencement.
2. In this order “day” means a period of twenty-four hours reckoned from nine o’clock in the morning. Interpretation.
3. The Welsh Water Authority may for the purpose of regulating the flow of water in the Afon Cwmystradllyn and the Afon Dwyfor discharge water at a rate not exceeding 15,000,000 gallons per day, from the Cwmystradllyn Reservoir as enlarged under the Welsh Water Authority (Cwmystradllyn Reservoir) Order 1979(b) into the Afon Cwmystradllyn at a point not more than 100 metres downstream from the most southerly part of the embankment of the said reservoir. Discharge of water.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order.)*

This order is made under the Water Resources Act 1971. It authorises the Welsh Water Authority to discharge water from the Cwmystradllyn Reservoir into the Cwmystradllyn River. The point of discharge is within an area designated by the Snowdonia National Park (Designation) Order 1951 and for that reason is by virtue of section 2(4)(a)(i) of the Act subject to annulment by resolution of either House of Parliament.
