# The Scholarships and Other Benefits (Amendment) Regulations 1979

Made - - - - 7th March 1979
Laid before Parliament 15th March 1979
Coming into Operation 6th April 1979

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 81 of the Education Act 1944 and vested in the Secretary of State(1), the Secretary of State for Education and Science, as respects England, and the Secretary of State for Wales, as respects Wales, hereby make the following Regulations:—

#### Citation and commencement

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Scholarships and Other Benefits (Amendment) Regulations 1979 and shall come into operation on 6th April 1979.

## **Amendment of regulations**

**2.** In Regulation 4(a) of the Scholarships and Other Benefits Regulations 1977 (grants of scholarships and other benefits) the words ", other than expenses in respect of clothing which the authority are authorised to provide by or under section 5 of the Education (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1948," shall be omitted.
