**The County Council of Hampshire  
(Basingstoke Canal—Odiham Bypass Bridge) Scheme 1978  
Confirmation Instrument 1979**

*Made - - - - 30th May 1979*

The Minister of Transport makes this Instrument in exercise of powers conferred by section 3 of the Highways (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1961(a) and now vested in him(b), and of all other enabling powers:

1. The County Council of Hampshire (Basingstoke Canal—Odiham Bypass Bridge) Scheme 1978 is hereby confirmed without modification.

2. The said Scheme as confirmed (hereinafter referred to as “the Scheme”) is set out in the Schedule hereto and copies of the Scheme with its accompanying plans are deposited at the offices of the Department of Transport, St. Christopher House, Southwark Street, London SE1 0TE, and at the offices of the County Council of Hampshire at The Castle, Winchester.

3. The Scheme will become operative on the date on which notice that it has been confirmed is first published in accordance with paragraph 1 of Schedule 2 to the Highways Act 1959(c).

4. This Instrument may be cited as the County Council of Hampshire (Basingstoke Canal—Odiham Bypass Bridge) Scheme 1978 Confirmation Instrument 1979.

**THE SCHEDULE TO THE INSTRUMENT**  
**THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF HAMPSHIRE**  
**(BASINGSTOKE CANAL—ODIHAM BYPASS BRIDGE) SCHEME 1978**

The County Council of Hampshire (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") make this Scheme in exercise of their powers under Section 3 of the Highways (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1961 and of all other enabling powers:

1. The Council are authorised to construct over the navigable waters of the Basingstoke Canal the bridge specified in the Schedule to this Scheme as part of the highway which they are proposing to construct between a point on the A.32 at its junction with the road leading to the Lord Derby Public House and a point at the junction of the A.287 with Broad Oak Lane (U.243) in the Parish of Odiham in the District of Hart.

2. This Scheme may be cited as the County Council of Hampshire (Basingstoke Canal—Odiham Bypass Bridge) Scheme 1978.

**THE SCHEDULE**

**PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS OF BRIDGE OVER BASINGSTOKE CANAL AT ODIHAM**

The site and general design of the bridge are shown on plans numbered A287/6/127 and A287/6/128 respectively, annexed hereto.

*Points of Commencement and Termination*

From a point—on the north bank of the Canal, Map reference 474904.91 east, 151641.34 north.

To a point—on the south bank of the Canal, Map reference 474911.53 east, 151633.18 north.

All on Ordnance Sheet SU 7451 NE.

(Being approximately 255 metres east of Colt Hill Bridge which carries the B.3016 road over the Canal.)

*Overall Dimensions*

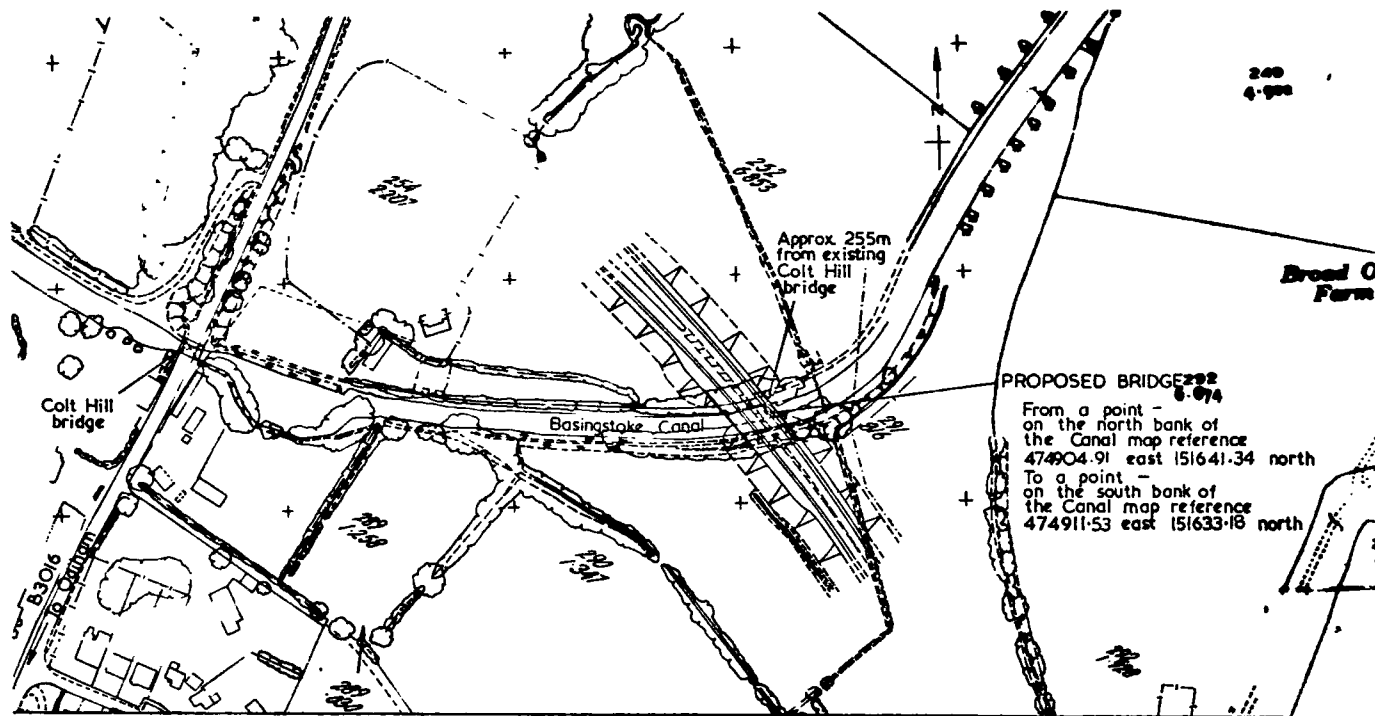
The Bridge will be 18.5 metres wide overall and will carry a 11.05 metres carriageway with a verge 1.5 metres wide on the north east side and 4.83 metres wide on the south west side. It will have an overall length of 30.7 metres.

*Main Navigation Span*

Single span of 9.00 metres over the Canal (inclusive of its 1.5 metre wide verge on the east side and its 2 metres wide towpath on the west side).

*Headway*

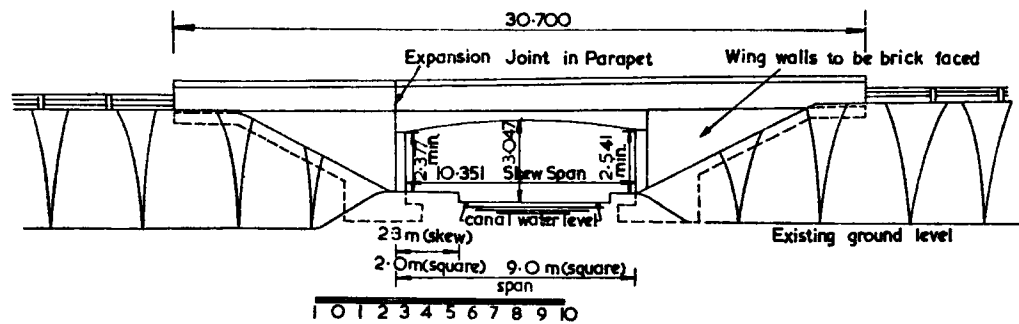
3.00 metres minimum above normal Canal level. The normal canal level is 0.22 metres below bank level. The bridge will provide a vertical clearance over the towpath of not less than 2.37 metres.

#### The Corn Returns (Amendment) Regulations 1979

Made - - - - - 31st May 1979

Coming into Operation 1st August 1979

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State acting jointly in exercise of powers conferred by sections 4, 5 and 14 of the Corn Returns Act 1882(a) and now vested in them(b), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following regulations:—

#### *Citation, interpretation and commencement*

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the Corn Returns (Amendment) Regulations 1979, shall be construed as one with the Corn Returns Regulations 1976(c) (in these regulations referred to as “the principal regulations”), and shall come into operation on 1st August 1979.

#### *Amendment of principal regulations*

2. Schedule 2 to the principal regulations (which sets out the form of return required by those regulations) shall be deleted from the principal regulations, and there shall be substituted therefor the Schedule to these regulations.
