LICENSING (LIQUOR)

**The Licensing (Repeal of State Management Provisions)
Order 1979**

Made - - - - - 27th July 1979

Coming into Operation 1st September 1979

Whereas it appears to me that the provisions of Part V of, and Schedule 9 to, the Licensing Act 1964(a) can have no further application:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the power conferred on me by section 5(1) and (2) of the Licensing (Abolition of State Management) Act 1971(b), I hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Licensing (Repeal of State Management Provisions) Order 1979 and shall come into force on 1st September 1979.
2. The enactments specified in the Schedule to this Order are hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE

ENACTMENTS REPEALED BY THIS ORDER

Licensing Act 1964 (c. 26.)

Sections 102, 104, 105, 106 and 107.

In section 200(1), the words "and, any premises where the Secretary of State carries on a business of selling liquor by retail in the exercise of powers conferred on him by Part V of this Act".

Schedule 9.

(a) 1964 c. 26.

(b) 1971 c. 65.

Gaming Act 1968 (c. 65.)

In paragraph 1(a) of Schedule 9, the words “and in relation to any premises in the district specified in Part I of Schedule 9 to the Licensing Act 1964 (the Carlisle district) which are for the time being used for the sale on behalf of the Secretary of State of intoxicating liquor for consumption on the premises”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order repeals those provisions of the Licensing Act 1964 which can have no further application following the disposal of property in the Carlisle State Management District under the Licensing (Abolition of State Management) Act 1971 and makes a consequential repeal in Schedule 9 to the Gaming Act 1968.
