INDUSTRIAL TRAINING

The Industrial Training (Engineering Board) Order 1980

Made - - - - 21st August 1980

Laid before Parliament 3rd September 1980

Coming into Operation 26th September 1980

The Secretary of State, on the recommendation of the Manpower Services Commission, and in exercise of his powers under section 9(1)(a), (5) and (6) of the Industrial Training Act 1964(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) Order 1980 and shall come into operation on 26th September 1980.

(2) In this Order—

- (a) “the Act” means the Industrial Training Act 1964;
- (b) “the Board” means the Engineering Industry Training Board;
- (c) “levy order” includes all levy orders set out in Schedule 2 to this Order;
- (d) “the 1971 Order” means the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) Order 1971(b);
- (e) “the 1974 Order” means the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) Order 1964 (Amendment) Order 1974(c);
- (f) “the principal Order” means the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) Order 1964(d).

Revocation

2. The 1971 Order and the 1974 Order are hereby revoked.

Activities of the Board

3. The activities in relation to which the Board exercises the functions conferred by the Act upon Industrial Training Boards shall, in lieu of the activities specified in Schedule 1 to the principal Order (as amended by the 1971 Order and the 1974 Order), be the activities specified in Schedule 1 to this Order, and accordingly in the principal Order the latter Schedule shall be substituted for the former Schedule.

Transitional Provisions

4.—(1) The Chairman and other members of the Board on the day upon which this Order comes into operation shall continue to be members of the

Board and to hold and vacate their offices in accordance with the terms of the instruments appointing them to be members.

- (2) The provisions of this Order shall not—
- (a) extend the operation of a levy order;
 - (b) affect the operation of a levy order in relation to the assessment of an employer within the meaning of that order in respect of an establishment that was engaged in the relevant levy period wholly or mainly in activities included in Schedule 1 to this Order;
 - (c) affect the operation of any assessment notice served by the Board under the provisions of a levy order before the day upon which this Order comes into operation or any appeal or other proceedings arising out of any such notice.

Article 3

SCHEDULE 1

THE ENGINEERING INDUSTRY

1. Subject to the provisions of this Schedule, the activities of the engineering industry are the following activities in so far as they are carried out in Great Britain:—

- (a) the manufacture of—
 - (i) articles wholly or mainly from metal or a metal carbide;
 - (ii) articles wholly or mainly from any combination of either metal and plastics material or of metal and a metal carbide;
 - (iii) aircraft or hovercraft;
 - (iv) articles embodying a lens or prism;
 - (v) primary cells, batteries or electric accumulators;
 - (vi) electric cables, electric filament lamps, electric discharge lamps or photographic flashbulbs;
 - (vii) thermionic, cold cathode or photo-cathode valves or tubes, cathode-ray tubes or electric capacitors or resistors;
 - (viii) printed or micro-electronic circuits, devices using ferrite or quartz crystals for electrical purposes or semi-conductor or piezo-electric devices;
 - (ix) patterns or models constructed for engineering or metal casting purposes;
- (b) the manufacture or fitting out of vehicle bodies where the employer is engaged in the manufacture of motor vehicles or where the vehicle bodies are manufactured or fitted out to the order of an employer engaged in the manufacture of motor vehicles;
- (c) the installation, testing, inspection or, except in the case of vehicle bodies, the repair of any articles or other products above-mentioned;
- (d) the painting or paint spraying of any articles specified in head (i), (ii), (iii) or (ix) of sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph;
- (e) the casting in non-ferrous metal (other than gold, silver or platinum) of sculptured figures;

- (f) the following operations or processes that is to say—
- (i) the reduction of virgin aluminium, the production of secondary-based aluminium or of aluminium alloys or the manufacture of aluminium powder or paste and, when carried out by an employer engaged substantially in any of the said operations, the production or processing of any other non-ferrous metal;
 - (ii) the smelting or refining of copper or copper alloys;
 - (iii) the rolling, drawing, extruding or forging of non-ferrous metal and, when carried out by an employer engaged substantially in any such operation, any refining of metal incidental thereto;
- (g) the following operations or processes, that is to say—
- (i) any process of metal preparation including mechanical or chemical cleaning;
 - (ii) tempering, case-hardening and annealing or other process of metal treatment;
 - (iii) electro-plating, anodising, polishing, burnishing, vitreous or stove enamelling or other metal finishing process;
- (h) the machining of carbon articles;
- (i) the erection of—
- (i) the main framework of buildings, being framework of metallic construction; or
 - (ii) other structures consisting wholly or mainly of metal, not being either structures forming part of a building, electric lines or structures designed for the support thereof, walls, fencing, hoardings, exhibition stands, scaffolding or contractors' plant;
- (j) the activities of—
- (i) assembly, construction, erection, installation, fitting, testing, inspection, repair or replacement on site of any chemical, electrical or mechanical apparatus, machinery or plant of a chemical works, gas making or gas treatment works, nuclear or thermal power station, hydro-electric station, oil refinery or oil terminal or other apparatus, machinery or plant concerned with exploration for or exploitation of oil or gas, metal smelter, steel mill, paper mill or brewery;
 - (ii) planning, designing, commissioning or procuring by way of contract or otherwise of any apparatus, machinery or plant mentioned in sub-paragraph (i) above carried on in association with any activity mentioned in that sub-paragraph or in association with any project for such an activity;
 - (iii) supervision of the assembly, construction, erection, installation, fitting, testing, inspection, repair or replacement of any apparatus, machinery or plant mentioned in sub-paragraph (i) above when carried out on site.
- (k) the preparation of engineering drawings;
- (l) the hiring out by an employer of individuals in his employment to persons engaging in any of the foregoing activities, where the said individuals are to be employed in such activities;
- (m) any activities, being—
- (i) related activities incidental or ancillary to principal activities of the engineering industry; or
 - (ii) activities undertaken in the administration, control or direction of one or more establishments, being establishments engaged wholly or mainly in principal activities of that industry, in related activities incidental or ancillary thereto, or in the administration control or direction of one or more other establishments engaged in such principal or related activities;

and carried out, in either case, by the employer engaged in those principal activities or, where that employer is a company, by the company or by an associated company of the company;

- (n) any activities of industry or commerce (other than engineering activities) carried out at or from an establishment mainly engaged—
- (i) in engineering activities; or
 - (ii) in engineering activities and in activities described in the Appendix to this Schedule, but to a greater extent in engineering activities than in activities described in that Appendix in relation to any one industry.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule, there shall not be included in the activities of the engineering industry:—

- (a) the activities of any establishment engaged—
- (i) mainly in activities not being engineering activities or activities described in the Appendix to this Schedule; or
 - (ii) to a less extent in engineering activities than in activities described in that Appendix in relation to any one industry;
- (b) the activities of any establishment engaged wholly or mainly in related activities, being activities—
- (i) incidental or ancillary to the activities of one or more establishments (in this sub-paragraph hereafter referred to as “the principal establishment”) engaged wholly or mainly in any activities not being principal activities of the engineering industry; and
 - (ii) carried out by the employer carrying on the principal establishment or, where that employer is a company, by the company or by an associated company of the company;
- (c) the activities of any establishment engaged wholly or mainly in one or more activities of a kind specified in an entry in the second column of the next following Table (being activities undertaken in relation to all or any of the products comprised in the group specified in the corresponding entry in the third column of that Table) or in two or more of such entries;

(d) the activities of any establishment engaged wholly or mainly in building work or civil engineering work, or (being operations undertaken in, upon, above or under a building, or the close, curtilage or precincts thereof, or a civil engineering work or the site of a building or such a work) in the provision or continued provision for the building, civil engineering work or site of water, gas, electricity, lighting, heating, ventilation or air-conditioning;

(e) the activities of—

(i) the Electricity Council, the Central Electricity Generating Board or an area Electricity Board;

- (ii) the North of Scotland Hydro-Electric Board or the South of Scotland Electricity Board;
 - (iii) the British Gas Corporation;
 - (iv) a harbour authority when acting in that capacity;
 - (v) a local authority;
 - (vi) statutory water undertakers within the meaning of the Water Act 1973(a) or regional water boards or water development boards within the meaning of the Water (Scotland) Act 1967(b), being the activities of such undertakers or boards in the exercise of their powers or duties as such; or
 - (vii) the Post Office or the United Kingdom Atomic Energy Authority;
- (f) when carried out by the National Coal Board any activities specified in paragraph 1(c) of this Schedule;
- (g) when carried out by the London Transport Executive any activities (not being design or drawing or the training of employees or apprentices) to which paragraph 1(m) of this Schedule applies;
- (h) the activities of a charity;
- (i) the activities of any company, association or body that is required by its constitution to apply its profits, if any, or other income in promoting its objects and is prohibited, thereby from paying any dividend to its members, and that has for its sole or principal object or among its principal objects the provision of facilities for any of the purposes mentioned in section 15(1) of the Disabled Persons (Employment) Act 1944(c) (which relates to the provision for registered persons who are seriously disabled of work or training);
- (j) any work, occupation or training that is provided in accordance with arrangements made by a local authority under the Disabled Persons (Employment) Act 1958(d) or any other enactment that authorises or requires the provision of arrangements for persons suffering from illness, severe physical defect or disability or from mental disorder, or for persons who have been suffering from illness or whose care is undertaken with a view to preventing them from becoming ill, or for old people;
- (k) any activities in agriculture;
- (l) any operations carried out by a person undergoing a course of training as a seagoing officer or rating under an agreement in writing with an employer in the shipping industry or with any organisation of employers in that industry or with any association of such organisations; or
- (m) the supply of food or drink for immediate consumption.

3. In this Schedule unless the context otherwise requires:—

“agriculture” has the same meaning as in section 109(3) of the Agriculture Act 1947(e) or, in relation to Scotland, as in section 86(3) of the Agriculture (Scotland) Act 1948(f);

“agricultural or horticultural machinery and equipment” means any machinery, plant, equipment or appliance designed primarily or adapted for use in agriculture or horticulture;

“aircraft” means any heavier than air aircraft;

“articles” includes any parts or components of articles, being parts or components made wholly or mainly from metal or a metal carbide or from any combination of either metal and plastics material or of metal and a metal carbide;

“audio or video receiving apparatus” does not include apparatus used or intended for use on a ship;

“broadcast relay station” means a station for the re-transmission by cable or wire, to the customers of the persons operating the station, of broadcast radio or

television programmes which those persons receive either by cable or wire or by wireless from the persons who broadcast the programmes;

“building work” means the construction, alteration, repair or demolition of a building or part of a building or of any erection in the nature of a building, but does not include any activities to which paragraph 1(i) or (j) of this Schedule applies or the installation, testing, inspection or repair of machinery or plant, not being contractors’ plant;

“charity” has the same meaning as in section 360 of the Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1970(a);

“civil engineering work” means the construction or demolition of a railway-line, siding or monorail, the construction, structural alteration, repair or demolition of any aerodrome, airport, bridge, road, viaduct, dock, harbour, pier, quay, wharf, coast protection, river or drainage work, aqueduct, canal, inland navigation, reservoir, waterworks, bore-hole, well (other than an oil well), filter bed, sewage works, sewer, cooling tower or pond, tunnel, heading, adit, chimney, furnace, carbonising or gas making or gas treatment works, nuclear or thermal power station, hydro-electric station, electric line or any structure designed for its support, cable trench or duct, oil refinery, pipeline or defence installation, the sinking of a shaft or bore-hole in a mine of coal, stratified ironstone, shale or fire-clay, the construction of a road below ground in such a mine, the construction of a swimming pool or other bathing place or of a playing field or ground for sporting or recreational purposes, the laying out of a cemetery or the preparation of the site, or the laying down of a foundation or sub-structure, in connection with any of the said operations or with the erection of structural metalwork, but does not include any activities to which paragraph 1(i) or (j) of this Schedule applies or the installation, testing, inspection or repair of machinery or plant, not being contractors’ plant;

“company” includes any body corporate, and “subsidiary” has the same meaning as by virtue of section 154 of the Companies Act 1948(b) it has for the purposes of that Act;

“contractors’ plant” means machinery, plant, or equipment of a kind used or intended for use in operations on the site of any building work or civil engineering work, but does not include lorries, ready-mixed concrete vehicles or other mechanically propelled vehicles mainly used for the carriage of goods on roads;

“electric line” means a wire or wires, conductor or other means used for the purpose of conveying, transmitting or distributing electricity, or any apparatus connected therewith;

“engineering activities” means any one or more of the principal activities of the engineering industry and the activities included in that industry by virtue of paragraph 1(m) of this Schedule;

“engineering process” means any one or more of the following and any similar processes when applied to metal, that is to say—

- (i) machining, grinding or bevelling;
- (ii) casting, forging, stamping, pressing, piercing or bending;
- (iii) sheet metal working, blacksmithing, welding or soldering;
- (iv) stove enamelling;

“floating construction” does not include hovercraft;

“furniture” means furniture of a type commonly used for bank, church, domestic, educational, garden, hospital, laboratory or office purposes, whether or not supplied for those purposes and whether designed to be free-standing or to be fixed to a building, but does not include—

- (a) awnings or inside or outside window blinds;
- (b) clocks or any instruments for recording atmospheric pressure or temperature;

- (c) household textiles whether or not containing filling;
- (d) pictures;
- (e) netting;
- (f) tapestries;

“glasses” means any appliances designed to correct, remedy or relieve any defect of sight, and includes spectacles of the kind known as sunglasses;

“harbour authority” means a harbour authority within the meaning of the Harbours Act 1964(a);

“hearing aids” means any appliances designed to correct, remedy or relieve any defect of hearing;

“hovercraft” means a vehicle which is designed to be supported when in motion wholly or partly by air expelled therefrom to form a cushion of which the boundaries include the ground, water or other surface beneath the vehicle;

“iron” and “steel” include respectively alloy iron and alloy steel containing in each case more than 55 per cent. of pure iron by weight;

“jewellery” includes any article of personal adornment (whether or not containing stones) but does not include clock or watch movements;

“local authority” means—

- (a) in relation to England and Wales, a local authority within the meaning of the Local Government Act 1972(b) or the Common Council of the City of London, and includes a joint board or joint committee of such authorities;
- (b) in relation to Scotland, a county council, town council or district council, and includes any joint board or joint committee of such authorities appointed under any enactment, order or scheme;

“manufacture” includes assembly and any process or operation incidental or appertaining to manufacture or assembly;

“motor vehicles” means mechanically propelled vehicles intended or adapted for use on road, and includes tramcars and trolley vehicles, but does not include implements for cutting grass that are not capable of being used or adapted for any other purposes or contractors’ plant;

“non-ferrous metal” means any metal not being iron or steel, and includes an alloy of any such metal;

“office premises” has the same meaning as in section 1(2) of the Offices, Shops and Railway Premises Act 1963(c);

“organs” means musical instruments consisting of a number of pipes supplied with wind or compressed air by means of bellows and sounded by means of keys;

“pipe-line” does not include a pneumatic despatch tube;

“plastics material” means any material (other than synthetic rubber of any kind) made wholly or mainly by addition, polyaddition, condensation, polycondensation, polymerisation, copolymerisation, esterification, or other similar chemical process, or regenerated or modified cellulose, or hardened proteins or natural resin modified by fusion or esterification, and includes any such material reinforced by glass fibres or bonding glass fibres;

“principal activities of the engineering industry” means activities which, subject to the provisions of paragraph 2 of this Schedule, are specified in paragraph 1, other than sub-paragraphs (m) and (n) thereof, as activities of the engineering industry;

“processing” in relation to plastics material means any of the following operations, that is to say, masticating, compounding, mixing, calendering, extruding, moulding, pressing, thermoforming, blowing, casting, dipping, coating, encapsulating, heat sealing, laminating, filament winding, machining (other than stitching), cutting, vulcanising or foaming;

“production” includes any process or operation incidental or appertaining to production;

“related activities” means any of the following activities, that is to say—

- (i) research, development, design or drawing;
- (ii) buying, selling, letting out on hire, testing, advertising, packing, distribution, transport or any similar operations;
- (iii) operations of a kind performed at office premises or laboratories, or at stores, warehouses or similar places;
- (iv) cleaning, washing or garaging vehicles or carrying out running repairs or minor adjustments thereto;
- (v) training of employees or apprentices;

“repair” includes all or any of the operations of repair, reconditioning, modification, alteration or conversion or the replacement of a part, but does not include cleaning or washing vehicles or carrying out running repairs or minor adjustments thereto;

“ship” includes any description of ship, vessel, boat or other floating craft, but does not include a hovercraft or an article that is inflatable by air, gas or liquid;

“toys and games” does not include sports requisites or coin or disc operated machines;

“vehicle bodies” includes motorcycle sidecars and bodies for caravans.

4.—(1) References in this Schedule to the provisions of any enactment shall be construed as references to those provisions as amended by or under any subsequent enactment.

(2) For the purposes of this Schedule two companies shall be taken to be associated companies if one is a subsidiary of the other or both are subsidiaries of a third company, and “associated company” shall be construed accordingly.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order redefines the activities in relation to which the Engineering Industry Training Board exercises its functions. The Board was established on 23rd July 1964 by the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) Order 1964. Its activities were redefined by the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) Order 1971 as amended by the Industrial Training (Engineering Board) Order 1964 (Amendment) Order 1974, which Orders are now revoked.

The only change made as respects the activities specified in the previous Orders is that amongst the activities henceforth to be included in the engineering industry are those of establishments engaged wholly or mainly in:—

- (a) the testing, inspection, repair or replacement on site of any apparatus, machinery or plant referred to in paragraph 1(j)(i) of Schedule 1;
- (b) the assembly, construction, erection, installation, fitting, testing, inspection, repair or replacement on site of apparatus, machinery or plant concerned with the exploration for or exploitation of oil or gas;
- (c) the planning, designing, commissioning or procuring of any of the apparatus, machinery or plant referred to in paragraph 1(j)(i) of Schedule 1 and the supervision of the activities carried on in accordance with that paragraph.
