The Fees for Cinematograph Licences (Variation) Order 1980

Made - - - - 15th September 1980

Laid before Parliament 24th September 1980

Coming into Operation 1st November 1980

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by sections 35(2) and 40(2) of, and Part II of Schedule 3 to, the Local Government Act 1966(a), I hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Fees for Cinematograph Licences (Variation) Order 1980 and shall come into operation on 1st November 1980.

2. Section 2(5) of the Cinematograph Act 1909(b) shall have effect as if—

- (a) for the sum “£15” in both places where it occurs, there were substituted the sum “£75”;
- (b) for the sum “£3·75” in the first place where it occurs, there were substituted the sum “£25”; and
- (c) for the sum “£3·75” in the second place where it occurs, there were substituted the sum “£15”.

3. The Fees for Cinematograph Licences (Variation) Order 1978(c) is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order raises the maximum fees payable for the grant, renewal and transfer of licences issued under section 2 of the Cinematograph Act 1909 for the use of premises in England and Wales for the purpose of cinematograph exhibitions (last raised by the Fees for Cinematograph Licences (Variation) Order 1978.

The maximum fees for the grant or renewal of a licence for a year are raised from £15 to £75, for the grant or renewal of a licence for monthly periods are raised from £3.75 to £25 for each month (subject to a maximum in any one year of £75), and for the transfer of a licence are raised from £3.75 to £15.
