**The East of Snaith-Sunderland Trunk Road (A1041)
(Humberside Detrunking) Order 1980**

Made - - - - - 23rd October 1980

Coming into Operation 1st December 1980

The Minister of Transport makes this Order in exercise of powers conferred by section 7 of the Highways Act 1959(a), section 27 of the Local Government Act 1966(b) and now vested in him(c), and of all other enabling powers:—

1. The length of trunk road described in the Schedule to this Order and shown by a series of black dashes on the deposited plan shall cease to be a trunk road and shall be classified as a principal road from the date on which this Order comes into operation.

2. In this Order:—

“the deposited plan” means the plan numbered HA 7/2-YH76 marked “The East of Snaith-Sunderland Trunk Road (A1041) (Humberside Detrunking) Order 1980”, signed by authority of the Minister and deposited at the Department of Transport, Becket House, Lambeth Palace Road, London SE1 7ER, where it may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours;

“principal road” as a classification for a highway, means that the highway is a principal road for the purposes of enactments and instruments which refer to highways classified as principal roads and is also classified for the purpose of every other enactment and instrument which refers to highways classified by the Minister;

“the trunk road” means the East of Snaith-Sunderland Trunk Road (A1041).

3. This order shall come into operation on 1st December 1980 and may be cited as the East of Snaith-Sunderland Trunk Road (A1041) (Humberside Detrunking) Order 1980.

SCHEDULE

LENGTH OF TRUNK ROAD CEASING TO BE A TRUNK ROAD

That length which commences 240 metres south-west of the centre of Carlton New Bridge on the River Aire and terminates at its junction with the Thorne to Goole Road (A614) in the County of Humberside, a distance of approximately 3.49 kilometres, measured along the said route.
