**The Social Security (Employed Earners' Employments for
Industrial Injuries Purposes) Amendment Regulations 1980**

Made - - - - - 7th November 1980
Laid before Parliament 10th November 1980
Coming into Operation 1st December 1980

The Secretary of State for Social Services, in exercise of the power conferred by section 51(2) of the Social Security Act 1975(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, after reference to the Industrial Injuries Advisory Council, hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation and commencement

1.—(1) These regulations, which may be cited as the Social Security (Employed Earners' Employments for Industrial Injuries Purposes) Amendment Regulations 1980, shall come into operation on 1st December 1980.

(2) In these regulations "the principal regulations" means the Social Security (Employed Earners' Employments for Industrial Injuries Purposes) Regulations 1975(b).

Insertion of new paragraphs in Part II of Schedule 1 to the principal regulations

2. After paragraph 2 in Part II of Schedule 1 to the principal regulations (employments not to be treated as employed earners' employments for industrial injuries purposes) there shall be inserted the following paragraphs—

"3. Employment—

- (a) as a member of the naval, military or air forces of a country to which a provision of the Visiting Forces Act 1952(c) applies by virtue of section 1 thereof; or
- (b) as a civilian by any such force, except where the person so employed is ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom.

4. Employment as a member of any international headquarters or defence organisation designated under section 1 of the International Headquarters and Defence Organisations Act 1964(d), except where the person so employed is ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These regulations amend the Social Security (Employed Earners' Employments for Industrial Injuries Purposes) Regulations 1975. They add provisions which provide that for industrial injuries purposes employment as a military or civilian member of a visiting force and employment as a member of a Headquarters or defence organisation designated under section 1 of the International Headquarters and Defence Organisations Act 1964, except, in either case, where a civilian is ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom, shall not be treated as employed earner's employment.
