**PROBATION AND AFTER-CARE**  
**The Combined Probation and After-Care Areas**  
**(Berkshire) Order 1980**

*Made* - - - - - *2nd December 1980*

*Coming into Operation*      *1st January 1981*

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 54(4) of, and paragraph 1 of Schedule 3 to, the Powers of Criminal Courts Act 1973(a) (as extended by Article 3 of the Combined Probation and After-Care Areas Order 1974(b)) and after the consultation required by that paragraph, I hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Combined Probation and After-Care Areas (Berkshire) Order 1980 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1981.

2. That part of Schedule 2 to the Combined Probation and After-Care Areas Order 1974(c) which relates to the Berkshire Probation and After-Care Committee shall be amended by—

(a) omitting the entry in respect of the petty sessions area of New Windsor; and

(b) substituting in column 3 “2” for “1” in each of the entries in respect of the petty sessions areas of Forest, Maidenhead and Windsor.

3. The two justices appointed to be members of the Berkshire Probation and After-Care Committee by the justices for the petty sessional divisions of New Windsor and Windsor and before those divisions were combined to form a new division known as the Windsor division shall continue to hold office as members of that Committee, as if they had been appointed by the justices for the new division, until 30th November 1983 and shall then cease to hold office, but shall be eligible for re-appointment.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order.)*

This Order amends the Combined Probation and After-Care Areas Order 1974 to take account of the combination of the petty sessional divisions of New Windsor and Windsor in the new petty sessional division of Windsor, effected by the Petty Sessional Divisions (Berkshire) Order 1980 (S.I. 1980/1818) which comes into operation on 1st January 1981, and also to vary the number of justices appointed by the justices for certain petty sessions areas to the Berkshire Probation and After-Care Committee. The total number of justices on the Committee is increased from 14 to 16.
