# LOCAL GOVERNMENT, ENGLAND AND WALES CHANGES IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS The North Wolds (Parishes) Order 1980

Whereas the Borough Council of North Wolds, under section 48(8) of the Local Government Act 1972(a), made recommendations to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England for proposals in relation to parishes in the borough;

And whereas the said Commission, under sections 47 and 51(1) of the said Act, made such proposals to the Secretary of State for the Environment:

Now therefore the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of the said Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

### Title and commencement

- 1. This order may be cited as the North Wolds (Parishes) Order 1980.
- 2. 1st January 1981 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into operation for any purposes set out in regulation 4(1) (Coming into operation of order) of the Regulations.

For all other purposes this order shall come into operation on the appointed day.

### Interpretation

- 3. In this order—
  - "the appointed day" means 1st April 1981;
  - "the county" means the County of Humberside;
- "the borough" means the Borough of North Wolds, and "the borough council" means the council of the borough;
  - "new parish" means a parish constituted by this order;
  - "new parish council" means a parish council established by this order; and

"the Regulations" means the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976(a) as amended by the Local Government Area Changes (Amendment) Regulations 1978(b).

# The boundary maps

### 4. In this order—

"the boundary maps" means the three maps printed for Her Majesty's Stationery Office by Ordnance Survey, each such map being marked "Map referred to in the North Wolds (Parishes) Order 1980" and with the number of the map; and

any reference to a numbered boundary map is a reference to the map described and numbered as aforesaid.

### Changes in areas

5.—(1) The part of the borough being the area of the former urban district of Driffield shall form a new parish to be known as the Parish of Driffield.

Nothing in this paragraph shall affect any ward of the borough.

The said new parish shall form or remain part of the Driffield electoral division of the county, of the Bainton Beacon petty sessional division and of the North Humberside coroner's district.

(2) The part of the Parish of Wilberfoss south of the continuous red line on boundary maps 1 and 2 shall form a new parish to be known as the Parish of Newton on Derwent.

The said new parish shall form or remain part of the Pocklington No. 2 electoral division of the county, of the Wilberfoss ward of the borough, of the Wilton Beacon petty sessional division and of the North Humberside coroner's district.

- (3) The parts of the Parish of Bielby shown hatched red on boundary map 3 shall be transferred to the Parish of Seaton Ross and shall form part of the Holme Beacon petty sessional division.
- (4) The part of the Parish of Seaton Ross shown coloured red on boundary map 3 shall be transferred to the Parish of Bielby and shall form part of the Wilton Beacon petty sessional division.

## Parish councils

- 6.—(1) There shall be a parish council for each new parish.
- (2) The new parish of Driffield shall be divided into two parish wards to be known as North and South, which shall respectively comprise the areas at the coming into operation of this order of the Driffield North and Driffield South wards of the borough. The number of parish councillors for such wards shall be 8 and 5 respectively.
- (3) The number of parish councillors for the new parish of Newton on Derwent shall be 5.
- (4) Elections of parish councillors of the new parishes shall be held on such day prior to the appointed day as the returning officer shall appoint and the parish council election rules for the time being in force shall apply to the said elections with any necessary modifications.

- (5) The persons elected as councillors as the result of the said elections shall come into office on the appointed day and shall retire on the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1983.
- (6) The annual meeting of each new parish council for 1981 shall be held in April 1981 and shall be convened by the officer appointed for that purpose by the borough council.

# Parish meetings

- 7.—(1) The first assembly of the parish meeting for any new parish shall be convened by the officer appointed for that purpose by the borough council.
- (2) At any such first assembly held before the annual meeting of the parish council of the parish, the parish meeting may appoint a person to take the chair, and that person shall have, for the purposes of that meeting, the powers and authority of the chairman.

# Expenses of new parish councils

8. In the year beginning on the appointed day the borough council shall levy rates and make payments to each new parish council as if that council had issued a precept to the borough council requiring the payment of the sum specified in respect of the parish in column (2) of the following table:—

### Local Acts, orders and byelaws

- 9.—(1) The existing parish of Wilberfoss is hereby specified in relation to regulation 41(4) (Local Acts, orders and byelaws) of the Regulations and the Parish of Newton on Derwent is hereby specified in relation to such area.
- (2) The provision of paragraph (1) is without prejudice to the operation of regulation 41(3) of the Regulations in respect of any parish as altered.

# **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

### This order—

- (a) constitutes two new parishes in the Borough of North Wolds, viz the Parish of Driffield, comprising the area of the former urban district of Driffield, and the Parish of Newton on Derwent, comprising part of the Parish of Wilberfoss;
- (b) effects small transfers as between the Parishes of Bielby and Seaton Ross.

Prints of the maps referred to in article 4 of the order may be inspected at the offices of the borough council. Prints may be purchased from the Department of the Environment's Map Library.

The approximate area, population and rateable value of the new parishes will be—

The order establishes a parish council for each new parish.

Incidental, consequential, transitional and supplementary provision in consequence of orders of the nature of the present one is contained in the Regulations defined in article 3 of the order.

The Regulations referred to will transfer property within the definition of "parish matters" in Schedule 6 therein from the borough council to the new parish council of Driffield. A further transfer of property may be effected by a second order when the borough council and the new parish council have been able to consider together.
