**The Extradition (Suppression of Terrorism) (Amendment)
Order 1980**

Made - - - - 19th March 1980
Laid before Parliament 27th March 1980
Coming into Operation 11th April 1980

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 19th day of March 1980

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Kingdom of Norway has become party to the European Convention on the Suppression of Terrorism signed at Strasbourg on 27th January 1977:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 2 of the Extradition Act 1870(a), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Extradition (Suppression of Terrorism) (Amendment) Order 1980 and shall come into operation on 11th April 1980.

2. The Extradition (Suppression of Terrorism) Order 1978(b) shall be amended by adding to Schedule 2 the following entry:—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order applies the Extradition Acts 1870-1895 in the case of the Kingdom of Norway, being a State party to the European Convention on the Suppression of Terrorism (which was signed at Strasbourg on 27th January 1977), subject to and in accordance with the extradition treaty made with it as amended by the Convention. In particular the Order makes extraditable the offences mentioned in Articles 1 and 2 of the Convention in so far as they are not already extraditable. The Order comes into operation on 11th April 1980 which is the date on which the Convention enters into force for Norway.
