**The London - Bristol Trunk Road (A4) (Colnbrook By-Pass
Diversion) Order 1981**

Made - - - - 30th November 1981

Coming into Operation 8th December 1981

The Secretary of State for Transport makes this Order in exercise of powers conferred by sections 10 and 41 of the Highways Act 1980(a) and now vested in him (b), and of all other enabling powers:—

1. The new highway which the Secretary of State proposes to construct along the route described in the Schedule to this Order shall become a trunk road as from the date when this Order comes into operation.

2. The centre line of the new trunk road is indicated by a heavy black line on the deposited plan.

3. The Secretary of State directs as respects any part of a highway which crosses the route of the new trunk road that—

- (a) where the highway is a highway maintainable at the public expense by a local highway authority, the part in question shall be maintained by that authority, and
- (b) where the highway is not a highway so maintainable and is not maintainable under a special enactment or by reason of tenure, enclosure or prescription, the Secretary of State shall be under no duty to maintain the part in question,

until, in either case, a date to be specified in a notice given by the Secretary of State to the highway authority for that highway. The date specified will not be later than the date on which the relevant route is opened for the purposes of through traffic.

4. In this Order:—

“the deposited plan”

means the plan folio numbered CSE 425/8C/26/03 marked “The London - Bristol Trunk Road (A4) (Colnbrook By-Pass Diversion) Order 1981”, containing one map, signed by authority of the Secretary of State and

deposited at the Department of Transport,
Romney House, 43 Marsham Street, London
SW1P 3PY;

“the new trunk road” means the highway mentioned in Article 1 of
this Order.

5. This Order shall come into operation on 8th December 1981 and may be
cited as the London - Bristol Trunk Road (A4) (Colnbrook By-Pass Diversion)
Order 1981.

SCHEDULE
ROUTE OF THE NEW TRUNK ROAD

The route of the new trunk road is a route at Colnbrook and Longford in the Counties of Buckinghamshire and Greater London as follows:—

A route starting at a point about 160 metres east of the Staines - West Drayton Railway line and proceeding in an easterly direction for about 600 metres ending about 80 metres west of the centre of A4/A3044 roundabout.

NOTE: 1 metre = 1.094 yards approximately.
