The Secretary of State being satisfied as respects the area hereinafter mentioned that certain waters therein are infected waters in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2(1) as read with section 11 of the Diseases of Fish Act $1937(\mathbf{a})$, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Diseases of Fish (Infected Area) (Scotland) (No. 11) Order 1981 and shall come into operation on 19 December 1981.

Infected area

2. The area comprising the fish farm known as Highland Fish Farmers Ltd., Sea Cage Site, Lochcarron owned by Highland Fish Farmers Ltd., and enclosed by a line beginning at grid reference 878371 and proceeding in a generally southerly direction to grid reference 877368, then extending out into Loch Carron in a south-easterly direction to grid reference 878365, then in a north-easterly direction to grid reference 883371 then returning to grid reference 878371, is hereby declared to be an infected area for the purposes of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937.

Control of movement of fish etc.

3. No person shall without the previous consent in writing of the Secretary of State move out of the area declared by Article 2 above to be an infected area any live fish or eggs of fish of foodstuff for fish.

This Order declares the Fish Farm known as Highland Fish Farmers Ltd., Sea Cage Site, Lochcarron owned by Highland Fish Farmers Ltd. described in this Order to be an infected area for the purposes of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937 and prohibits the movement out of the area of any live fish, eggs of fish or foodstuff for fish.
