The Secretary of State being satisfied as respects the area hereinafter mentioned that certain waters are infected waters, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2(1) as read with section 11 of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937(a), and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Diseases of Fish (Infected Area) (Scotland) (No. 5) Order 1981 and shall come into operation on 30th March 1981.

Infected area

2. The area comprising the Stronachullin fish farm site of Fish Farm Developments from OS Grid Reference 854798 due south to 854793 and from that reference due west to the eastern edge of the A83, north along the eastern edge of the A83 to 851798 and from there due east to 854798 is hereby declared to be an infected area for the purposes of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937.

Control of movement of fish etc.

3. No person shall without the previous consent in writing of the Secretary of State move out of the area declared by Article 2 above to be an infected area any live fish or eggs of fish or foodstuff for fish.

This Order declares the Fish Farm Developments Ltd, Stronachullin fish farm site, described in this Order to be an infected area for the purposes of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937 and prohibits the movement out of the area of any live fish, eggs of fish or foodstuff for fish.
