Coming into Operation

11th September 1982

The Secretary of State being satisfied as respects the area hereinafter mentioned that certain waters therein are infected waters, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2(1) as read with section 11 of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937 (a), and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Diseases of Fish (Infected Area) (Scotland) (No. 19) Order 1982 and shall come into operation on 11th September 1982.

Infected area

2. The area comprising Lower Mill Loch and the hatchery at Mingarry, Lochboisdale, South Uist, lying between the aforementioned Lower Mill Loch and Upper Mill Loch, adjacent to the main Lochboisdale to Lochmaddy road owned by Highland Trout Company (Scotland) Limited is hereby declared to be an infected area for the purposes of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937.

Control of movement of fish etc.

3. No person shall without the previous consent in writing of the Secretary of State move out of the area declared by Article 2 above to be an infected area any live fish or eggs of fish or foodstuff for fish.

This Order declares Lower Mill Loch and the Hatchery at Mingarry, Lochboisdale, South Uist owned by Highland Trout Co. (Scotland) Ltd. to be an infected area for the purposes of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937 and prohibits the movement out of the area of any live fish, eggs of fish or foodstuff for fish.
