The Revocation of Instrument of Management (Eagle House, Bathford) Order 1982

Made - - - 20th September 1982

Coming into Operation 30th September 1982

Whereas the Trustees of Eagle House, Bathford have given not less than 2 years notice in writing to the Secretary of State and to the Somerset County Council of their intention to cease to provide the controlled community home known as Eagle House, Bathford as from 7th October 1983;

And whereas the body of managers of the aforesaid home have given notice in writing to the Secretary of State that they are unwilling to continue as managers of the home until the date specified in the first mentioned notices;

Now therefore the Secretary of State for Social Services in exercise of his powers under section 43(4) of the Child Care Act 1980(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Revocation of Instrument of Management (Eagle House, Bathford) Order 1982 and shall come into operation on 30th September 1982.

Revocation of Instrument of Management

2. The Eagle House, Bathford Instrument of Management Order 1973 and the Eagle House, Bathford Instrument of Management (Variation) Order 1976 are hereby revoked.

Conduct of the Home

3. The Somerset County Council shall conduct the controlled community home known as Eagle House and situate at Bathford, Avon until 8th October 1982 as if it were a community home provided by the aforesaid Council.
