**The Extradition (Internationally Protected Persons)
(Amendment) Order 1982**

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 10th day of February 1982
Present,
The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas certain amendments to the Extradition (Internationally Protected Persons) Order 1979 (a) are required in respect of changes to parties to the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of Crimes against Internationally Protected Persons including Diplomatic Agents (hereinafter referred to as "the Convention") signed at New York on 14th December 1973 (b) and in respect of territories to which the Convention is applied:

And Whereas it is expedient that the amendments to Schedules 2, 3 and 4 to the above-mentioned Order, specified in subsequent amending Orders (c), should be consolidated:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by sections 2, 17 and 21 of the Extradition Act 1870 (d) and sections 3(2) and 4(1) of the Internationally Protected Persons Act 1978 (e), or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Extradition (Internationally Protected Persons) (Amendment) Order 1982 and shall come into operation on 12th March 1982.

2. The Extradition (Internationally Protected Persons) Order 1979 shall be amended by substituting in place of the entries in Schedule 2 (which names the foreign States which are parties to the Convention and with which extradition treaties are in force) the entries specified in Schedule 1 hereto.

3. The Extradition (Internationally Protected Persons) Order 1979 shall be amended by substituting in place of the entries in Part I of Schedule 3 (which names the foreign States which are parties to the Convention and with which no extradition treaties are in force) the entries specified in Schedule 2 hereto.

4. The Extradition (Internationally Protected Persons) Order 1979 shall be further amended by substituting in place of the entries in Schedule 4 (which names the territories to which the Order extends) the entries specified in Schedule 3 hereto.

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

Changes in parties to the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of Crimes against Internationally Protected Persons, including Diplomatic Agents, signed at New York on 14th December 1973 and the attainment of independence by Belize and the Gilbert Islands have necessitated amendments to Schedule 3 to the Extradition (Internationally Protected Persons) Order 1979 (which names foreign States parties to the Convention and with which no extradition treaties are in force) and to Schedule 4 to the 1979 Order (which names the territories to which it extends). The opportunity has been taken to consolidate the amendments to Schedules 2, 3 and 4 to the 1979 Order.
