CHANGES IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS

The Glanford (Parishes) Order 1982

Made - - - - 1st December 1982

Coming into Operation—

*for the purposes described
in article 2(1)*

1st January 1983

for all other purposes

1st April 1983

Whereas the Borough Council of Glanford, under section 48(8) of the Local Government Act 1972(a), made recommendations to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England for proposals in relation to parishes in the borough;

And whereas the said Commission, under sections 47 and 51(1) of the said Act, on 1st May and 2nd December 1981, made such proposals to the Secretary of State for the Environment:

Now therefore the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of the said Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order giving effect to the said proposals with modifications—

Title and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Glanford (Parishes) Order 1982.

2.— (1) 1st January 1983 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into operation for any purposes set out in regulation 4(1) (Coming into operation of order) of the Regulations as modified by paragraph (2).

For all other purposes this order shall come into operation on the appointed day.

(2) In the said regulation 4(1), item (e) shall not apply to the constitution of the new parish council.

Interpretation

3. In this order—

“the appointed day” means 1st April 1983;

“the county” means the County of Humberside;

“the borough” means the Borough of Glanford, and “the borough council” means the council of the borough;

“the new parish” means the Parish of New Holland constituted by this order;

“the new parish council” means the parish council of the new parish;

“the proper officer”, in relation to any purpose, means the officer appointed for that purpose by the borough council; and

“the Regulations” means the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976(a) as amended by the Local Government Area Changes (Amendment) Regulations 1978(b).

The boundary maps

4. In this order—

“the boundary maps” means the 6 maps printed for Her Majesty’s Stationery Office by Ordnance Survey, each such map being marked “Map referred to in the Glanford (Parishes) Order 1982” and with the number of the map; and any reference to a numbered boundary map is a reference to the map described and numbered as aforesaid.

Changes in areas

5.— (1) That part of the Parish of Barrow upon Humber north-east of the red line on boundary map 1 shall constitute a new parish to be known as the Parish of New Holland.

The new parish shall remain part of the Ferry electoral division of the county, of the Abbey ward of the borough, of the Barton upon Humber petty sessional division and of the Scunthorpe coroner’s district.

(2) That part of the Town of Broughton which is shown coloured red on boundary map 6 shall be transferred to the Parish of Scawby and shall form part of the Ridge electoral division of the county and of the Scawby ward of the borough.

(3) That part of the Parish of Gunness which is shown coloured red on boundary maps 2, 3, 4 and 5 shall be transferred to the Parish of Burringham and shall form part of the Ridge electoral division of the county and of the Trentside ward of the borough.

New parish: council and meeting

6.— (1) There shall be a parish council for the new parish.

(2) From the appointed day until 9th May 1983 any councillor of the Parish of Barrow upon Humber in office immediately before the appointed day who resides in the new parish shall be a councillor of the new parish.

(3) As from 9th May 1983 the number of parish councillors for the new parish shall be 9. Parish councillors shall be elected on 5th May 1983. The persons elected shall come into office on 9th May 1983 and shall retire on the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1987.

(4) The annual meeting of the new parish council for 1983 shall be convened by the proper officer of the borough council.

(5) The first assembly of the parish meeting for the new parish shall be convened by the proper officer appointed of the borough council. If such first assembly is held before the annual meeting of the new parish council, the parish meeting may appoint a person to take the chair, and that person shall have, for the purposes of that meeting, the powers and authority of the chairman.

Parish Council of Barrow upon Humber

7.—(1) Any councillor to whom article 6(2) applies shall cease to hold office as councillor of the Parish of Barrow upon Humber.

(2) As from 9th May 1983 the number of parish councillors for the Parish of Barrow upon Humber shall be reduced from 15 to 12.

Parish Council of Burringham

8. As from 9th May 1983 the number of parish councillors of the Parish of Burringham shall be increased from 9 to 10.

Expenses of new parish council

9. In the year beginning on the appointed day the borough council may, if they think fit, levy rates in the new parish and make payments to the new parish council as if the new parish council had issued a precept to the borough council requiring the payment of a sum not exceeding the product of a rate of 2p in the pound calculated on the total rateable value as set out in the valuation list on the appointed day.

Local Acts, orders and byelaws

10.—(1) The Parish of Barrow upon Humber is hereby specified in relation to regulation 41(4) (Local Acts, orders and byelaws) of the Regulations and the new parish of New Holland is hereby specified in relation to such area.

(2) The provision of paragraph (1) is without prejudice to the operation of regulation 41(3) in respect of any parish as altered.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This order effects the following operations in the Borough of Glanford—

- (a) the constitution of a new parish, namely the Parish of New Holland, from part of the Parish of Barrow upon Humber; and
- (b) two transfers between parishes.

The map forming part of this note shows the areas. This map also incorporates a grid identifying the maps referred to in article 4 of this order.

The new parish will have approximately an area of 507 hectares, a population of 800 and a rateable value of £65,265.

The order establishes a parish council for the new parish.

Prints of the maps referred to in article 4 of the order may be inspected at the offices of the borough council. Prints may be purchased from the Department of the Environment's Map Library.

Incidental, consequential, transitional and supplementary provision in consequences of orders of the nature of the present one is contained in the Regulations defined in article 3 of the order.

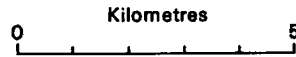
Parishes as from 1 April 1983

Name of new parish shown in bold italics

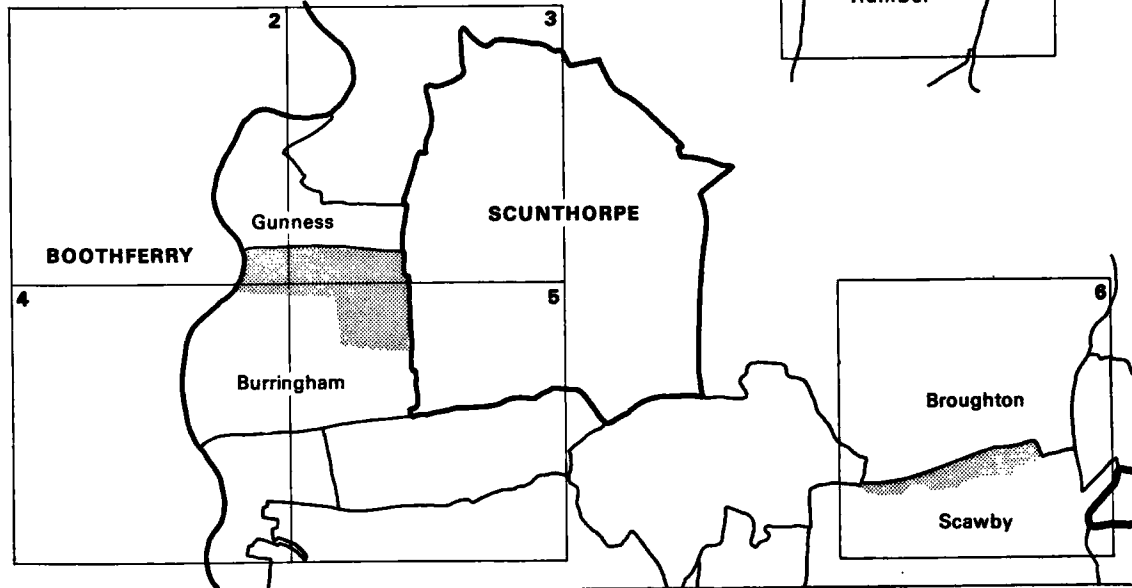
Areas transferred as between existing parishes
