WATER, ENGLAND AND WALES

The Cambridge Water (Duxford) Order 1982

Made --16th March 1982Coming into Operation31st March 1982

The Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of powers conferred by section 23 of the Water Act 1945 (a) and now vested in him (b) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Cambridge Water (Duxford) Order 1982 and shall come into operation on 31st March 1982.

(2) The Cambridge Water Acts and Orders 1853 to 1979 and this order may be cited together as the Cambridge Water Acts and Orders 1853 to 1982.

2. In this order, unless the context otherwise requires—

"the Company" means the Cambridge Water Company;

"the Third Schedule" means the Third Schedule to the Water Act 1945;

"the undertaking" means the undertaking of the Company as for the time being authorised by any enactment.

3. For the purposes of this order, the provisions of the Third Schedule which are specified in column (1) of Schedule 1 to this order shall, subject to the modifications set out in column (2) thereof, apply to the undertaking and are hereby incorporated with this order.

4.—(1) The Company may—

- (a) continue and maintain the existing borehole on and under the lands described in Schedule 2 to this order and construct or continue and maintain on or under such lands a pumping station (to be called "the Duxford Grange Pumping Station") and pumping plant for the purpose of abstracting water from the said borehole;
- (b) construct and maintain on or under the lands described in the said Schedule 2 (in addition to the works authorised by section 4 of the Third Schedule as applied to the undertaking by this order) all such additional boreholes, wells, adits and headings as may be necessary or expedient for augmenting, improving or maintaining the supply of water obtainable by means of the said borehole.

(2) The works authorised by this order shall for all purposes form part of the undertaking.
