The Secretary of State being satisfied as respects the area hereinafter mentioned that certain waters, therein are infected waters in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2(1) as read with section 11 of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937(a), and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

#### Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Diseases of Fish (Infected Area) (Scotland) (No. 2) Order 1982 and shall come into operation on 23rd January 1982.

### Infected area

2. The area comprising the Marybank fish farm but excluding the hatchery and owned by Kincardine Fisheries Ltd enclosed in a square between OS Grid References 757760, 759760, 757758 and 759758 is hereby declared to be an infected area for the purposes of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937.

### Control of Movement of Fish etc

3. No person shall without the previous consent in writing of the Secretary of State move out of the area declared by Article 2 above to be an infected area any live fish or eggs of fish or foodstuff for fish.
