The Secretary of State for Transport makes this Order in exercise of powers conferred by sections 10 and 12 of the Highways Act 1980(a) and now vested in him (b), and of all other enabling powers:—

1. The length of trunk road described in the Schedule to this Order and shown by a series of black dashes on the deposited plan shall cease to be a trunk road and shall be classified as a principal road as from the date on which this Order comes into operation.

2. In this Order:

"the deposited plan"

means the plan numbered HA10-YH82 marked "The Widmerpool-Nottingham-Bawtry-Goole-Howden Trunk Road (A614) (Austerfield Roundabout to A18 East of Hatfield) (Detrunking) Order 1982" signed by authority of the Secretary of State and deposited at the Department of Transport, Romney House 43 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3PY;

"principal road"

as a classification for a highway, means that the highway is a principal road for the purposes of enactments and instruments which refer to highways classified as principal roads and is also classified for the purpose of every other enactment and instrument which refers to highways classified by the Secretary of State;

"the trunk road"

means the Widmerpool-Nottingham-Bawtry-

Goole-Howden Trunk Road (A614).

3. This Order shall come into operation on 11th June 1982 and may be cited as the Widmerpool-Nottingham-Bawtry-Goole-Howden Trunk Road (A614) (Austerfield Roundabout to A18 East of Hatfield) (Detrunking) Order 1982.

SCHEDULE

LENGTH OF TRUNK ROAD CEASING TO BE A TRUNK ROAD

That length of the trunk road which extends from and includes the roundabout at Austerfield and terminates at its junction with the A18 east of Hatfield, a distance measured along the said route of about 15.4 kilometres (9.5 miles approximately).
