**The Customs Duties (Quota Relief)  
(Paper, Paperboard and Printed Products)  
(Amendment) Order 1983**

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 1 of the Customs and Excise Duties (General Reliefs) Act 1979(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Duties (Quota Relief) (Paper, Paperboard and Printed Products) (Amendment) Order 1983 and shall come into operation on 17th August 1983.

2. In the Customs Duties (Quota Relief) (Paper, Paperboard and Printed Products) Order 1982(b) in the entry in column 3 of Schedule 6 relating to subheading ex 48.07D of the common customs tariff of the European Economic Community, in respect of coated printing paper, weighing less than 225 g/m<sup>2</sup>, for “23,707 tonnes” there shall be substituted “31,278 tonnes” and for “13,667 tonnes” there shall be substituted “21,238 tonnes”.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order.)*

This Order, which comes into operation on 17th August 1983, amends the Customs Duties (Quota Relief) (Paper, Paperboard and Printed Products) Order 1982 by increasing the duty-free tariff quota which the United Kingdom is entitled to open under Protocol No. 1 to the Agreement between the European Economic Community and Finland (OJ No. L328, 28.11.1973, p. 2) for coated mechanical printing paper weighing not more than 65 g/m<sup>2</sup> falling within subheading 48.07D of the common customs tariff of the European Economic Community and originating in Finland from 13,667 tonnes to 21,238 tonnes. The duty-free tariff quota for all coated printing paper, weighing less than 225 g/m<sup>2</sup> falling within subheading 48.07D is accordingly increased from 23,707 tonnes to 31,278 tonnes. This is in accordance with an agreement in the form of a recent exchange of letters approved by Council Regulation (EEC) No. 1678 (OJ No. L165, 24.6.1983, p. 1) amending the quota which the United Kingdom is entitled to open for 1983 under the terms of Protocol No. 1.
