The Police (Amendment) Regulations 1983

<i>Made - - - -</i>	14th February 1983
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	22nd February 1983
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	1st April 1983

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section 33 of the Police Act 1964 (a) and after furnishing the Police Negotiating Board for the United Kingdom with a draft of the Regulations in accordance with section 2(1) of the Police Negotiating Board Act 1980(b), I hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Police (Amendment) Regulations 1983.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation on 1st April 1983 and shall have effect for the purposes of Regulation 4 as from 1st July 1982, for the purposes of Regulation 5 as from 1st January 1983, for the purposes of Regulation 6 as from 6th April 1983, for the purposes of Regulation 7 as from 27th October 1982 and for all other purposes as from 1st April 1983.

3. In these Regulations any reference to the principal Regulations is a reference to the Police Regulations 1979 (c).

4. In Regulation 36 of the principal Regulations and in paragraph 3(2) of Schedule 4 thereto for the words “£657” there shall be substituted the words “£762”.

5. In Regulation 41(2)(a) of the principal Regulations after the words “British Nationality Act 1948” there shall be inserted the words “, a dependent territory within the meaning of the British Nationality Act 1981(d)” and for the words “protectorate or protected state” in the second place where they occur there shall be substituted the words “protectorate, protected state or dependent territory”.

6. Regulation 42 of the principal Regulations shall be amended as follows:—

(a) at the end of the heading there shall be added the words “and statutory sick pay”; and

(b) for paragraph (1) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(1) There shall be deducted from the pay of a member of a police force—

(a) the amount of any sickness benefit, invalidity pension or invalidity allowance to which he is entitled under the Social Security Acts 1975–1982, and

(b) any statutory sick pay to which he is entitled under the Social Security and Housing Benefits Act 1982, (e)

and for the purposes of sub-paragraph (a) above any increase for adult and child dependants shall be treated as forming part of the benefit or allowance to which it relates.”.

7. In Regulation 51(6) of the principal Regulations for the words “£500” there shall be substituted the words “£600”.

8. In paragraph 1 of Schedule 3 to the principal Regulations sub-paragraph (1A) shall be omitted and, in the second column of the Table, for the words “18 days” there shall be substituted the words “20 days”.

9. Paragraph 4(2)(d) of Schedule 4 to the principal Regulations shall be omitted.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Police Regulations 1979 with effect, as provided by Regulation 2, from 1st April 1983 or as mentioned below (retrospection is authorised by section 33(4) of the Police Act 1964).

Regulation 4 increases, with effect from 1st July 1982, the London weighting payable to a member of the City of London or metropolitan police force and the corresponding supplement payable to a member of another police force who takes up residence as a university scholar within the City of London or the metropolitan police district.

Regulation 5 amends, with effect from 1st January 1983, the reference to the British Nationality Act 1948 (c.56) in Regulation 41 of the 1979 Regulations, in consequence of the coming into operation on that date of the British Nationality Act 1981.

Regulation 6 amends Regulation 42 of the 1979 Regulations, with effect from 6th April 1983, in respect of the benefits which are deductible from pay as a consequence of the coming into operation of the Social Security and Housing Benefits Act 1982. References to injury benefit and earnings related supplement are omitted and a reference to statutory sick pay under the 1982 Act is added.

Regulation 7 increases, with effect from 27th October 1982, the maximum removal allowance.

Regulation 8 consolidates an earlier amendment to the 1979 Regulations increasing the annual leave entitlement of constables with less than 10 years' service from 18 days to 20 days.

Regulation 9 revokes a spent provision of the 1979 Regulations.
