CHANGES IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS

The Amber Valley (Parishes) Order 1984

Made - - - - - 6th February 1984

Coming into Operation—

*for the purposes described
in article 2(1)* - - - - 16th February 1984

for all other purposes - - - - 1st April 1984

Whereas the District Council of Amber Valley, acting pursuant to section 48(8) of the Local Government Act 1972(a), has made recommendations to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England for proposals about parishes in the district:

And whereas the said Commission has seen fit, pursuant to sections 47, 48(9) and 51(1) of that Act, on 14th April 1982, to make the recommended proposals, with modifications, to the Secretary of State:

And whereas the Secretary of State has decided to give effect to those proposals with a further modification:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of the said Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Title and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Amber Valley (Parishes) Order 1984.

2.— (1) 16th February 1984 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into operation for any purpose set out in regulation 4(1) (coming into operation of order) of the Regulations.

(2) For all other purposes this order shall come into operation on 1st April 1984.

Interpretation

3. In this order—

(a) 1972 c.70.

“the boundary maps” means the 11 maps issued by the Department of the Environment in 6 sheets, each sheet being marked “Map sheet of the Amber Valley (Parishes) Order 1984” and with the number of the sheet, any reference to a map by number and letter being a reference to the map so lettered on the sheet so numbered;

“the county” means the county of Derbyshire;

“the district” means the district of Amber Valley, and “the district council” means the council of the district;

“new parish” means a parish constituted by this order;

“new parish council” means a parish council established by this order;

“new parish ward” means a parish ward formed by this order; and

“the Regulations” means the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976(a).

Changes in areas

4.— (1) There shall be constituted 7 new parishes to be known by the names specified in column (1) of Schedule 1 to this order, consisting of the areas described in column (2) and shown outlined in red on the boundary maps mentioned in column (3). Where parish wards are indicated in relation to a new parish in column (4), that parish shall be divided into the named wards, which shall consist of the areas duly marked and shown by broken red lines on the boundary maps. Each new parish or parish ward shall remain or form part of the ward of the district and electoral division of the county specified in respect thereof in columns (6) and (7). Each new parish shall be comprised in the petty sessional division mentioned in column (8) and in the Derby and South Derbyshire coroner’s district.

(2) The parts of parishes described in column (1) of Schedule 2 to this order and marked on the boundary maps as specified in column (2) shall, in so far as parishes, wards thereof, electoral divisions of the county, wards of the district and petty sessional divisions are specified in respect thereof in columns (3) to (7), be transferred to and form part of such areas.

(3) That part of the area of the former urban district of Heanor shown coloured green and marked C1 on boundary map 2a shall be transferred to, and form part of the parish of Denby, of the Horsley electoral division of the county and of the Denby and Horsley Woodhouse ward of the district.

Parish councils

5.— (1) There shall be a parish council for each new parish.

(2) The number of parish councillors for each new parish not divided into parish wards and for each new parish ward shall be that shown in respect of the parish or parish ward in column (5) of Schedule 1 to this order.

(3) Elections of parish councillors of each new parish shall be held on such day prior to 1st April 1984 as the returning officer shall appoint and shall be

conducted in accordance with rules made under section 36 of the Representation of the People Act 1983(a) relating to the conduct of elections of parish councillors.

(4) The persons elected as councillors as the result of the said elections shall come into office on 1st April 1984 and shall retire on the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1987.

(5) The annual meeting of each new parish council for 1984 shall be convened by the proper officer of the district council.

Parish meetings

6.— (1) The first assembly of the parish meeting for any new parish shall be convened by the proper officer of the district council.

(2) At any such first assembly held before the annual meeting of the parish council of the parish, the parish meeting may appoint a person to take the chair, and that person shall have, for the purposes of that meeting, the powers and authority of the chairman.

Expenses of new parish councils

7. In the year beginning on 1st April 1984, the district council may levy rates in each new parish named in column (1) of the following table and make payments to the new parish council as if the new parish council had issued a precept to the district council requiring the payment of a sum equal to the product of a rate of the amount in the pound, calculated on the total rateable value as set out in the valuation list on 1st April 1984, specified in respect of the parish in column (2).

Statutory definitions of areas

8. In any application of paragraph (1) (statutory definitions of areas) of regulation 40 of the Regulations to a reference to—

- (i) the former urban district of Alfreton; and
- (ii) the former urban district of Heanor

the following provisions namely—

(a) 1983 c.2.

“For any reference to the area of the former urban district of Alfreton there shall be substituted a reference to the parishes of Alfreton, Ironville, Somercotes and Swanwick and the remainder of the said area.”

“For any reference to the area of the former urban district of Heanor there shall be substituted a reference to the parishes of Aldercar and Langley Mill, Codnor, and Heanor and Loscoe”.

shall have effect in place of sub-paragraph (b).

Local Acts, orders and byelaws

9.— (1) The area named in any entry in column (1) of the following table shall be a relevant area within the meaning of regulation 41 (Local Acts, orders and byelaws) of the Regulations, and is hereby specified in relation to paragraph (4) of that regulation, and the areas described in respect of such area in column (2) are hereby specified in relation to such area—

(2) The provision of paragraph (1) is without prejudice to the operation of regulation 41(3) of the Regulations in respect of any area as altered.

District ward boundaries

10. The boundary of the Aldercar ward of the district shall be extended between points A and B on boundary map 3b so that the said ward comprises the whole of the new parish of Aldercar and Langley Mill.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the order.)

This order—

- (a) creates seven new parishes in the district of Amber Valley, namely the parishes of Alfreton, Ironville, Somercotes and Swanwick from part of the area of the former urban district of Alfreton, and the parishes of Aldercar and Langley Mill, Codnor, and Heanor and Loscoe from the area of the former urban district of Heanor;
- (b) transfers areas as between parishes in the district; and
- (c) transfers part of the area of the former urban district of Heanor to the parish of Denby.

The map forming part of this note (page 8) shows the areas affected.

Prints of the boundary maps referred to in article 3 of the order may be inspected at the offices of the district council, and may be purchased from the Department of the Environment's Map Library.

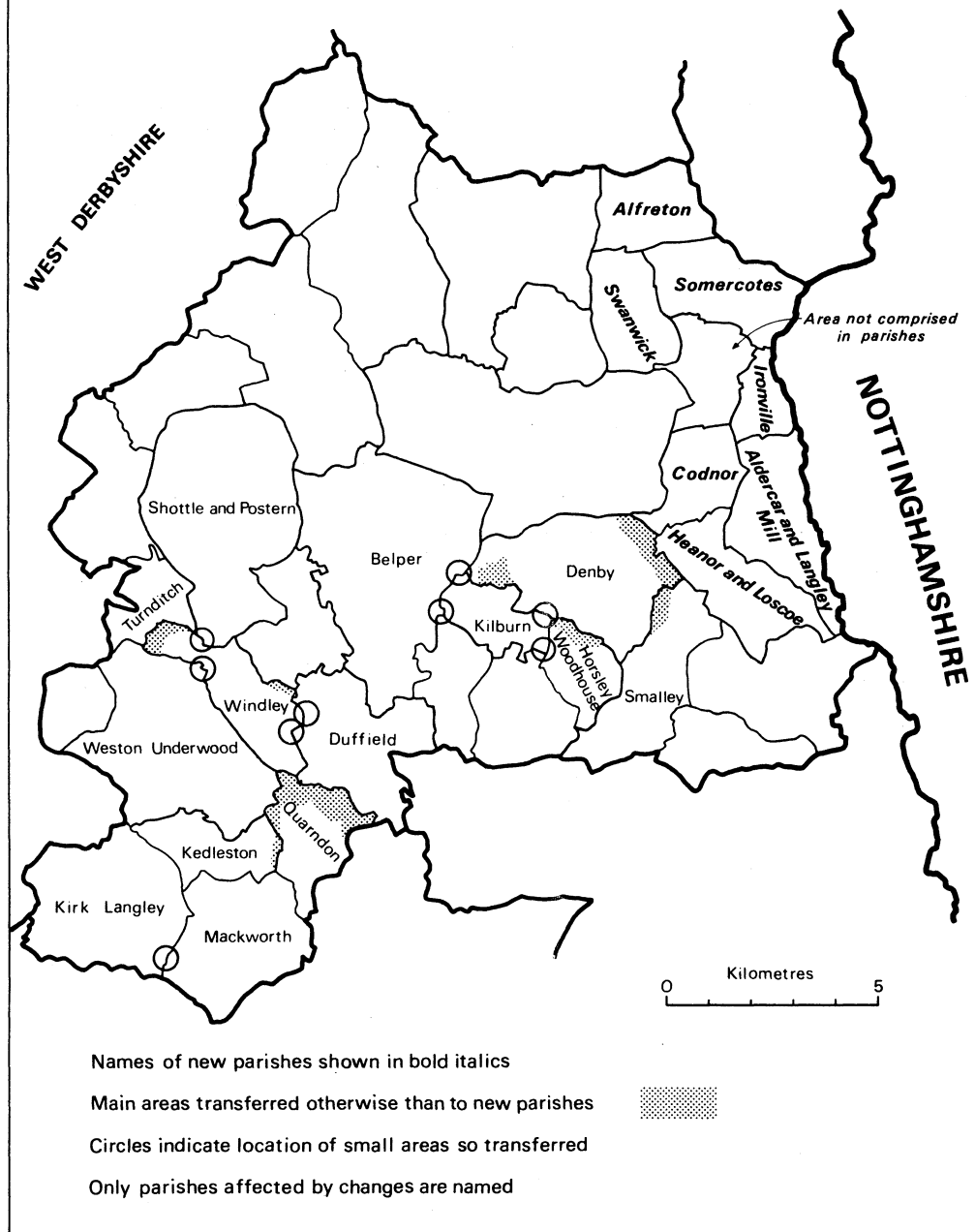
