The Tribunal and Inquiries (Foreign Compensation Commission) Order 1984

The Lord Chancellor and the Lord Advocate, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 15(1) and (4) of the Tribunals and Inquiries Act 1971(a), hereby make the following Order:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Tribunals and Inquiries (Foreign Compensation Commission) Order 1984 and shall come into operation on 3rd September 1984.

(2) In this Order “the Act of 1971” means the Tribunals and Inquiries Act 1971.

2. Part I of Schedule 1 to the Act of 1971 shall have effect as if there were specified therein the Commission (called the Foreign Compensation Commission) which was constituted under section 1 of the Foreign Compensation Act 1950(b).

3. Section 10 of the Act of 1971(c) shall have effect as if for the words “the Commissioners of Inland Revenue or the Commissioners of Customs and Excise” there were substituted the words “the Commissioners of Inland Revenue, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise or the Foreign Compensation Commission”.

4. Section 19(4) of the Act of 1971 shall have effect as if for the words "References in this Act to the working or a decision of, or procedural rules for," there were substituted the words "References in this Act to the working or a decision of, or procedural rules for, the Foreign Compensation Commission or".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order brings under the supervision of the Council on Tribunals the Commission constituted under section 1 of the Foreign Compensation Act 1950 (the Foreign Compensation Commission). It requires the Foreign Compensation Commission to consult the Council before making procedural rules governing proceedings before the Commission. Under the Order, the supervision of the Council does not extend to the working, decisions or procedure of the Commission when it is exercising executive functions.
