The Consular Fees (Amendment No. 2) Order 1984

Made - - - - - 22nd November 1984
Coming into Operation 1st January 1985

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 22nd day of November 1984

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the power conferred upon Her by section 1(1) of the Consular Fees Act 1980 (a), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall come into operation on 1st January 1985 and may be cited as the Consular Fees (Amendment No. 2) Order 1984.

2. Part II of the table of consular fees in the Schedule annexed to the Consular Fees Order 1983 (b) shall be amended by substituting for Fee 22 the following:—

“22 Granting a visa or entry permit—	£
for an ordinary visa or entry permit	10.00
for a transit visa or permit	8.00
for a multiple entry visa or permit	20.00
or for any visa or entry permit such sums, being the equivalents of fees charged by the authorities of any State for granting a visa or entry permit to a British citizen, as the Secretary of State, with the consent of the Treasury, directs to be taken for granting a visa or entry permit to a national or citizen of that State except where a United Kingdom visa is issued on a foreign passport held by a person who is a British citizen, British Dependent Territories citizen, British Overseas citizen, or British Protected person”.
