# The Reservoirs Act 1975 (Supervising Engineers Panel) (Applications and Fees) Regulations 1984

Made - - - - 29th November 1984

Coming into Operation 20th December 1984

The Secretary of State having determined, after consultation with the Reservoirs Act Consultative Committee of the Institution of Civil Engineers, that a separate panel of civil engineers shall be constituted for the purposes of section 12 of the Reservoirs Act 1975(a), in exercise of his powers under sections 4(2) and 5 of that Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, makes the following regulations:—

#### Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Reservoirs Act 1975 (Supervising Engineers Panel) (Applications and Fees) Regulations 1984 and shall come into operation on 20th December 1984.

### **Applications**

- 2.—(1) An application under section 4(2) of the Reservoirs Act 1975 to be appointed a member of the panel of civil engineers constituted for the purposes of section 12 of the Act shall be in writing, shall include the information set out in the Schedule to these regulations and shall be sent, together with the prescribed fee and a reference from a civil engineer as to the suitability of the applicant for appointment, to the Secretary of State for the Environment.
- (2) The prescribed fee to accompany an application referred to in paragraph(1) of this regulation shall be £50.

## Regulation 2

#### **SCHEDULE**

#### **RESERVOIRS ACT 1975**

Information required from applicants for the panel of Supervising Engineers:

- 1. Full name of applicant.
- 2. Address of applicant.
- 3. Date of birth of applicant.
- 4. Relevant qualifications of applicant.

(a) 1975 c. 23.

- 5. Applicant's membership of Professional Institutions.
- 6. Particulars of past and present employment of applicant, including
  - i. dates of any appointment,
  - ii. details of the reservoirs, including their capacity and main dimensions, in connection with the design construction, management, maintenance or repair of which the applicant has been employed,
  - iii. details of the nature and extent of the applicants responsibility for any reservoir in relation to which he has been employed, that is to say, whether he had responsibility for the design, construction or operation of the reservoir and to what degree of supervision he was subject,
  - iv. the name and address of any engineer under whose supervision the applicant worked.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the regulations.)

The Secretaries of State for the Environment, Wales and Scotland have determined that there shall be a number of different panels of civil engineers for the purposes of the Reservoirs Act 1975. One of these panels will consist of those civil engineers who may be employed under section 12 of the Act, which provides for the supervision of large raised reservoirs. These regulations prescribe the manner in which a civil engineer may apply to be appointed to that panel. They also prescribe the fee which is to accompany such an application.
