Whereas the Local Government Boundary Commission for England, acting pursuant to sections 47 and 51(1) of the Local Government Act 1972(a), has made proposals to the Secretary of State for the transfer of a small part of the borough of Boothferry in the county of Humberside to the district of Selby in the county of North Yorkshire and for a minor alteration in the boundary between the boroughs of Beverley and Boothferry in the county of Humberside;

And whereas the Secretary of State has decided to give effect to those proposals:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) of the said Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Title and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Humberside and North Yorkshire (Areas) Order 1984.

2.-- (1) 1st February 1985 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into operation for any purposes set out in regulation 4(1) (coming into operation of order) of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976(b).

(2) For all other purposes, this order shall come into operation on 1st April 1985.

Boundary maps

3. In this order, "the boundary maps" means the 2 maps (duly numbered for reference) which are issued by the Department of the Environment as "Maps of the Humberside and North Yorkshire (Areas) Order 1984".

Changes in areas

4.—(1) The area marked A on boundary map 1 shall be transferred—

- (a) from the county of Humberside to the county of North Yorkshire;
- (b) from the borough of Boothferry to the district of Selby; and
- (c) from the parish of Pollington to the parish of Balne.

It shall form part of the Whitley ward of the district of Selby, of the Osgoldcross electoral division of the county of North Yorkshire, of the Selby petty sessional division, and of the Claro coroner's district.

(2) The area marked B on boundary map 2 shall be transferred from the East Yorkshire borough of Beverley to the borough of Boothferry, and from the parish of South Cave to the parish of Broomfleet.

It shall form part of the East Howdenshire ward of the borough of Boothferry, of the Howdenshire electoral division of the county of Humberside, of the South Hunsley Beacon petty sessional division, and of the North Humberside and Scunthorpe coroner's district.

Town and Country Planning

5.— (1) The provisions of the following plans made or adopted by the Humberside County Council shall, insofar as they apply to the area transferred by article 4(1), have effect as if they were similar plans made or adopted by the North Yorkshire County Council:—

The structure plan.

The old development plan (within the meaning of paragraph 2 of Schedule 7 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971(a).

A local plan.

(2) Any provisions applicable to either area transferred by article 4 of any local plan which has been adopted by the council of the borough from which the area is transferred shall have effect as if they were a local plan adopted by the council of the borough or district to which the area is transferred.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the order.)

This order—

- (a) makes a minor alteration in the boundary between the counties of Humberside and North Yorkshire by transferring a small area from the borough of Boothferry to the district of Selby; and
- (b) transfers a very small area in the county of Humberside from the East Yorkshire borough of Beverley to the borough of Boothferry.

The maps forming part of this note (page 4) give a guide to the areas affected.

Prints of the detailed boundary maps, which form part of the order and are referred to in article 3, may be inspected at the offices of the borough and district councils, and may be purchased from the Department of the Environment's Map Library, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1.

Consequential changes to local government electoral areas are made.

The Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976, mentioned in article 2(1), contain further provisions about the effect and implementation of orders such as the present one.
