**The Telecommunication Apparatus (Advertisements)
(Amendment) Order 1985**

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the power conferred on him by section 29 of the Telecommunications Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Telecommunication Apparatus (Advertisements) (Amendment) Order 1985.

(2) Articles 1, 2 and 4 of this Order shall come into operation on 9th July 1985 and Article 3 shall come into operation on 1st February 1986.

Interpretation

2.—(1) In this Order, “the principal Order” means the Telecommunication Apparatus (Advertisements) Order 1985(b).

(2) Any word or expression used in this Order shall unless the context otherwise requires have the same meaning as it has in the principal Order.

Amendments to the principal Order

3.—(1) In Article 2 of the principal Order, the definition of “relevant system” shall be replaced by the following:—

““relevant system” means—

- (a) a public telecommunication system run by British Telecommunications plc or Kingston-upon-Hull City Council;

(a) 1984 c. 12.

(b) S.I. 1985/719.

- (b) in relation to apparatus approved for connection to a public telecommunication system run by Mercury Communications Limited as well as to such a system run by British Telecommunications plc or Kingston-upon-Hull City Council, that system; or
- (c) a cellular radio system run by Telecom Securicor Cellular Radio Limited or Racal Vodafone Limited;”.

(2) In Article 3 of the principal Order, the words “or relevant branch system” shall be added at the end of paragraph (1).

Application of the principal Order

4. The principal Order shall not apply to any advertisement published before 1st February 1986, to the extent to which it relates to apparatus which is—

- (a) capable of being connected to any cellular radio system run by Telecom Securicor Cellular Radio Limited or Racal Vodafone Limited or to any relevant branch system which is connected to such a cellular radio system, and
- (b) not capable of being connected to a relevant system of any other description or to any relevant branch system which is connected to a relevant system of such other description.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order amends the Telecommunication Apparatus (Advertisements) Order 1985 (“the principal Order”). By amending the definition of “relevant system” it brings within the scope of the principal Order apparatus which is capable of being connected to cellular radio systems (but not to other relevant systems) but which is not approved for connection to such systems. It extends the principal Order to include advertisements for apparatus which is capable of being connected to branch systems which are themselves connected to relevant systems but which is not capable of being connected directly to relevant systems. It excludes from the application of the principal Order, until 1st February 1986, apparatus intended exclusively for use with cellular radio systems.
