Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 6(1) of, and paragraph 4(5) of Schedule 1 to the Films Act 1985(a), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to provide, and is hereby provided, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Films Co-Production Agreements (Amendment) Order 1985 and shall come into operation on 8th January 1986.

2. The Films Co-Production Agreements Order 1985(b) shall be amended by substituting for the Schedule the following—

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

The Films Co-Production Agreements Order 1985 (“the principal Order”) provides that films made in accordance with the agreements between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Governments of the countries listed in the Schedule are to be treated as British films for the purposes of Schedule 1 to the Films Act 1985 (Certification for the purposes of section 72 of the Finance Act 1982 (c.39) in case of British films). The present Order extends the list of agreements scheduled to the principal Order to include an amendment to the agreement of 12th September 1975 with Canada which was made by an exchange of letters dated 9th July 1985 (Cmnd. 9605). It also amends the form of the Schedule to enable the listed agreements to be more easily identified.
