LOCAL GOVERNMENT, ENGLAND AND WALES CHANGES IN LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREAS

The Derbyshire (District Boundaries) Order 1985

Made - - - - 23rd December 1985
Laid before Parliament 9th January 1986
Coming into operation for the purposes
described in article 2(1) 31st January 1986
for all other purposes 1st April 1986

Whereas the Local Government Boundary Commission for England, acting pursuant to sections 47 and 51(1) of the Local Government Act 1972(a) has made proposals to the Secretary of State about alterations in the boundary between the districts of Bolsover and North East Derbyshire:

And whereas more than six weeks has elapsed since those proposals were made:

And whereas the Secretary of State has decided to give effect to the proposals:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) of that Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Title and commencement

- 1. This order may be cited as the Derbyshire (District Boundaries) Order 1985.
- 2.—(1) 31st January 1986 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into operation for any purpose set out in regulation 4(1) (coming into operation of order) of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976(b).
- (2) For all other purposes, this order shall come into operation on 1st April 1986.

Interpretation

3. In this order, "the boundary maps" means the 2 maps issued by the Department of the Environment as the "Maps of the Derbyshire (District Boundaries) Order 1985"; and

"county electoral division" means an electoral division of the county of Derbyshire.

Transfers from North East Derbyshire to Bolsover

- 4. The parts of the district of North East Derbyshire and of the parish of Eckington which are marked A and D on boundary map 1 shall be transferred to—
 - (a) the district of Bolsover;
 - (b) the district ward and parish of Barlborough; and
 - (c) the Clowne county electoral division.

Transfers from Bolsover to North East Derbyshire

- 5.—(1) The parts of the district of Bolsover, and of the parish of Barlborough which are marked B and C on boundary map 1 shall be transferred to—
 - (a) the district of North East Derbyshire;
 - (b) the parish and county electoral division of Eckington; and
 - (c) the parish ward and district ward of Renishaw.
- (2) The part of the district of Bolsover, and of the parish of Ault Hucknall which is marked E on boundary map 2 shall be transferred to—
 - (a) the district of North East Derbyshire;
 - (b) the Holmewood and Heath district ward;
 - (c) the parish of Heath; and
 - (d) the Sutton county electoral division.

Town and County Planning

- 6.—(1) Any provisions of a local plan adopted by the North East Derbyshire district council which apply immediately prior to 1st April 1986 to an area transferred by article 4 shall continue to have effect in relation thereto as if they were part of a local plan adopted by the Bolsover district council.
- (2) Any provisions of a local plan adopted by the Bolsover district council which apply immediately prior to 1st April 1986 to an area transferred by article 5 shall continue to have effect in relation thereto as if they were part of such plan adopted by the North East Derbyshire district council.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the order.)

This order alters the boundary between the districts of Bolsover and North East Derbyshire, affecting the parishes of Ault Hucknall and Barlborough (in Bolsover) and Eckington and Heath (in North East Derbyshire).


The map forming part of this note (page 4) gives a general guide to the areas affected by this order as from 1st April 1986.

Prints of the detailed boundary map referred to in article 3 may be inspected at the offices of the district councils, and may be inspected or purchased from Department of the Environment's Map Library, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB.

Consequential changes to local government electoral areas are made.

The areas transferred by article 4 are small, and have no population or rateable value. The areas transferred by article 5 total approximately 20.5 hectares, with a population of 50 and a rateable value of £57,700.

The Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976, mentioned in article 2(1), contain further provisions about the effect and implementation of orders such as the present one.
