The Leicestershire and Nottinghamshire (County and District Boundaries) Order 1985

Whereas the Local Government Boundary Commission for England, acting pursuant to sections 47 and 51(1) of the Local Government Act 1972(a), has made proposals to the Secretary of State for alterations of the boundary between the counties of Leicestershire and Nottinghamshire, and of boundaries or districts in those counties:

And whereas more than six weeks has elapsed since the proposals were made:

And whereas the Secretary of State has decided to give effect to those proposals:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) of that Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

Title and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Leicestershire and Nottinghamshire (County and District Boundaries) Order 1985.

2.—(1) 31st January 1986 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into operation for any purpose set out in regulation 4(1) (coming into operation of order) of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976 (b).

(2) For all other purposes, this order shall come into operation on 1st April 1986.

The boundary maps

3. In this order, "the boundary maps" means the 6 maps (duly numbered for reference) which are issued by the Department of the Environment as the "Maps of the Leicestershire and Nottinghamshire (County and District Boundaries) Order 1985".

Transfers from Leicestershire to Nottinghamshire

4. The following areas of the county of Leicestershire—

(i) the part of the parish of Hathern and of the borough of Charnwood marked A4 on boundary map 5; and

(ii) the part of the parish of Long Whatton and of the district of North West Leicestershire marked A6 on boundary map 2—

shall be transferred to—

- (a) the county of Nottinghamshire;
- (b) the borough of Rushcliffe, and the Soar Valley borough ward;
- (c) the parish of Sutton Bonington;
- (d) the East Leake electoral division of Nottinghamshire;
- (e) the Nottingham (County) petty sessional division; and to
- (f) the Nottinghamshire coroner's district.

Transfers from Nottinghamshire to Leicestershire

5.—(1) That part of the county of Nottinghamshire, of the borough of Rushcliffe, and of the parish of Orston which is marked A3 on boundary map 4 shall be transferred to—

- (a) the county of Leicestershire;
- (b) the borough of Melton;
- (c) the borough ward and parish of Bottesford;
- (d) the Belvoir electoral division of Leicestershire;
- (e) the Melton and Belvoir petty sessional division; and to
- (f) the County of Leicestershire Northern coroner's district.

(2) The parts of the county of Nottinghamshire, of the borough of Rushcliffe, and of the parish of Sutton Bonington which are marked A5 and A7 on boundary map 2 shall be transferred to—

- (a) the county of Leicestershire;
- (b) the district of North West Leicestershire;
- (c) the district ward, parish, and parish ward of Long Whatton;
- (d) the Breedon electoral division of Leicestershire;
- (e) the Loughborough petty sessional division; and to
- (f) the County of Leicestershire Northern coroner's district.

District transfers within Nottinghamshire

6.—(1) The part of the parish of Holme Pierrepont and of the borough of Rushcliffe which is marked A1 on boundary map 1 shall be transferred to—

- (a) the city of Nottingham;
- (b) the city ward and county electoral division of Trent; and to
- (c) the Nottingham (City) petty sessional division.

(2) The part of the parish of East Bridgford and of the borough of Rushcliffe which is marked A2 on boundary map 3 shall be transferred to—

- (a) the district of Newark and Sherwood;
- (b) the Dover Beck district ward;
- (c) the parish of Hoveringham;
- (d) the Southwell electoral division of Nottinghamshire; and to
- (e) the Newark and Southwell petty sessional division.

District transfer within Leicestershire

7. That part of the parish of Nailstone and of the borough of Hinckley and Bosworth which is marked A8 on boundary map 6 shall be transferred to—

- (a) the district of North West Leicestershire;
- (b) the Ibstock and Heather district ward;
- (c) the parish of Ibstock and the Ellistown and Battram parish ward; and to
- (d) the Ibstock electoral division of Leicestershire.

Statutory definitions of areas, etc.—Nottingham

8.—(1) For the purposes of regulation 40 (statutory definitions of areas) of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976, any reference to the area of the former county borough of Nottingham shall be construed as including the area mentioned in article 6(1).

(2) Regulation 41 (Local Acts, orders and byelaws) of those Regulations shall apply to the area of the former county borough of Nottingham as if it were a relevant area within the meaning of regulation 41(2). For the purposes of any provision in force to which that regulation applies, that area shall include the area mentioned in article 6(1).

Town and County Planning

9.—(1) Any provisions of—

- (a) the structure plan;
- (b) the old development plan (within the meaning of paragraph 2 of Schedule 7 to the Town and Country Planning Act 1971(a));
- (c) a local plan adopted by a county council—

which apply immediately prior to 1st April 1986 to an area transferred by article 4 or 5 shall continue to have effect in relation thereto as if they were part of a corresponding plan made or adopted by the council of the county to which the area is transferred.

(2) Any provisions of a local plan adopted by a borough or district council which apply to an area transferred by article 4, 5, 6 or 7 immediately prior to 1st April 1986 shall continue to have effect in relation thereto as if they were part of such a plan adopted by the council of the city, borough or district to which the area is transferred.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the order.)

This order—

(a) makes minor alterations in the boundary between the counties of Leicestershire and Nottinghamshire, affecting in Leicestershire the boroughs of Charnwood and Melton and the North West Leicestershire district, and in Nottinghamshire, the borough of Rushcliffe;

(b) transfers two small areas from the borough of Rushcliffe in Nottinghamshire, one to the city of Nottingham, and the other to the district of Newark and Sherwood; and

(c) transfers a small area of the borough of Hinckley and Bosworth in Leicestershire to the district of North West Leicestershire.

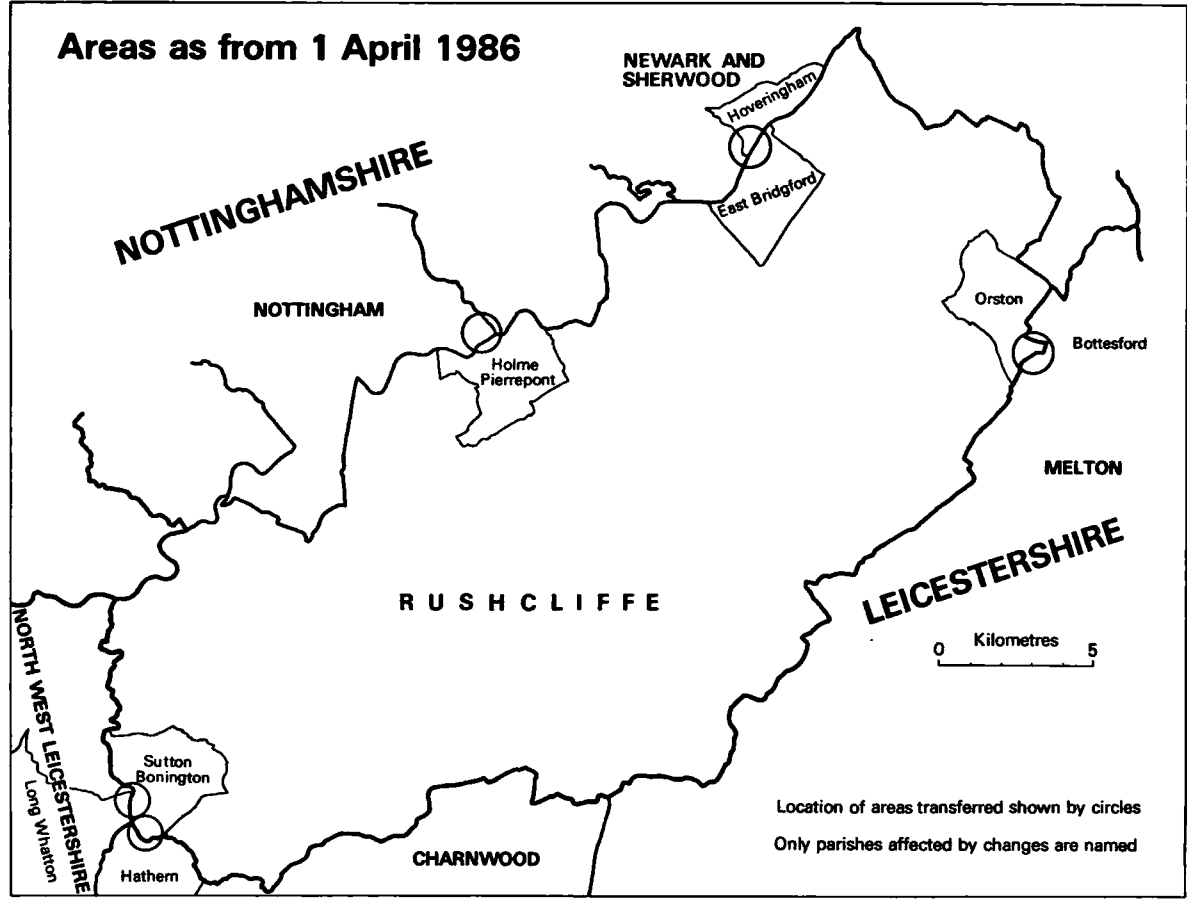
The map forming part of this note (page 5) gives a general guide to the changes mentioned in (a) and (b) above. The change mentioned in (c) above involves an area of about 16 hectares located in the north-eastern corner of the parish of Nailstone.

Prints of the detailed boundary maps referred to in article 3, may be inspected at the offices of the county, city, borough and district councils, and may be inspected or purchased at the Department of the Environment's Map Library, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB.

Consequential changes to local government electoral areas are made.

The Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976, mentioned in articles 2(1) and 8, contain further provisions about the effect and implementation of orders such as the present one.
