The South Wight (Parishes) (Variation) Order 1985

The Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 266(2) of the Local Government Act 1972(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:—

1. This order may be cited as the South Wight (Parishes) (Variation) Order 1985 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1985.

2. In the South Wight (Parishes) Order 1984(b)—

- (1) for article 4(2)(a), there shall be substituted—
 - "(a) In the new parishes of Lake and Sandown, no changes are made in the boundaries of such electoral divisions, save that incidental to article 4(3)(b), and accordingly the areas of those parishes shall continue to be comprised in the divisions specified in column (3) of Schedule 1 to this order.
 - (aa) The new parish of Rookley shall form part of the Gatcombe and Godshill electoral division".
- (2) for article 4(3)(a), there shall be substituted—
 - "(a) In the new parish of Lake, no changes are made in the boundaries of such wards, and accordingly the area of that parish shall continue to be comprised in the Lake ward.
 - (aa) The new parish of Rookley shall form part of the Gatcombe and Godshill ward of the borough".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This order varies the South Wight (Parishes) Order 1984 which, inter alia, created a new parish of Rookley from parts of the parishes of Arreton and Godshill.

Further provision is made as respects the borough ward and county electoral division to which the parish is to belong. It is to form part of the Gatcombe and Godshill ward and division.
