The Crown Prosecution Service (Witnesses' Allowances)
(Amendment) Regulations 1986

The Attorney General, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 14(1)(b) and (2) of the Prosecution of Offences Act 1985(a), and with the approval of the Treasury, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Crown Prosecution Service (Witnesses' Allowances) (Amendment) Regulations 1986 and shall come into operation on 2nd June 1986.

2. In Schedule 1 to the Crown Prosecution Service (Witnesses' Allowances) Regulations 1986(b), in Column 3 of the Table, which sets out relevant amounts in relation to allowances payable under those Regulations—

- (a) for the sum of £24 in the entry for Regulation 6(a) (financial loss allowance in respect of certain expenditure incurred by a witness who attends to give evidence other than professional or expert) there shall be substituted £25.40; and
- (b) for the sums of £12 and £24 in the entry for Regulation 6(b) (financial loss allowance in respect of certain losses suffered by such witness) there shall be substituted £12.70 and £25.40 respectively.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations increase the maximum financial loss allowance payable under Regulation 6 of the Crown Prosecution Service (Witnesses' Allowances) Regulations 1986 to a witness who, at the instance of the Crown Prosecution Service, attends court to give evidence (other than professional or expert) and thereby incurs certain expenditure or suffers certain loss as described in that Regulation.
