**The Education (Assisted Places) (Incidental Expenses)
 (Amendment) Regulations 1986**

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by sections 18 and 35(4) of the Education Act 1980(a), the Secretary of State for Education and Science, as respects England, and the Secretary of State for Wales, as respects Wales, hereby make the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Education (Assisted Places) (Incidental Expenses) (Amendment) Regulations 1986.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on 8th July 1986 for the purposes of—

- (a) determining the questions referred to in Regulation 6 of the principal Expenses Regulations (questions arising under Regulations 3, 4 and 5) in so far as they relate to a school year beginning on or after 1st September 1986, and
- (b) the payment of uniform grant in pursuance of the proviso to Regulation 3(3) of those Regulations during the two months immediately preceding a pupil's first assisted year where that year begins on or after 1st September 1986,

and on 1st September 1986 for all other purposes.

2. In these Regulations a reference to the principal Expenses Regulations is a reference to the Education (Assisted Places) (Incidental Expenses) Regulations 1985(b).

3. For paragraphs (3) and (4) of Regulation 3 of the principal Expenses Regulations (uniform grants) there shall be substituted the following paragraphs—

“(3) In a pupil's first assisted year, uniform grant shall be payable in the case of an assisted pupil as respects whom the relevant income does not exceed £7,563 and in such case the grant shall be of an amount equal to so much of the clothing expenditure as does not exceed—

- (a) £115, where the relevant income does not exceed £6,638;
- (b) £87, where that income exceeds £6,638 but does not exceed £6,949;
- (c) £58, where that income exceeds £6,949 but does not exceed £7,248;
- (d) £29, where that income exceeds £7,248 but does not exceed £7,563:

(a) 1980 c.20.

(b) S.I. 1985/830.

Provided that any uniform grant which would fall to be paid in a pupil's first assisted year may be paid during the two months immediately preceding that year.

(4) In any subsequent school year uniform grant shall be payable in the case of an assisted pupil as respects whom the relevant income does not exceed £7,248, and in such case the grant shall be of an amount equal to so much of the clothing expenditure (disregarding expenditure in respect of which a previous grant has been paid) as does not exceed—

(a) £43, where the relevant income does not exceed £6,806;

(b) £21, where that income exceeds £6,806 but does not exceed £7,248.”

4. In Regulation 4(5) of the principal Expenses Regulations (school travel grants) for the sums of “£6,389” and “£6,210” there shall be substituted the sums of “£6,819” and “£6,638” respectively.

5. In Regulation 5(2) of the principal Expenses Regulations (remission of charges for meals) for the sum of “£5,400” there shall be substituted the sum of “£5,773”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Education (Assisted Places) (Incidental Expenses) Regulations 1985. The Regulations come into operation on 8th July 1986 for specified preliminary purposes and on 1st September 1986 for all other purposes (*Regulation 1(2)*).

The means tests for uniform grants, school travel grants, and the remission of charges for meals are relaxed (*Regulations 3 to 5*).
