REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE

The Returning Officers' Expenses (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1987

The Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 29(3) of the Representation of the People Act 1983(1), hereby make the following Regulations:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Returning Officers' Expenses (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1987, and shall come into force on 20th May 1987.

2. The maximum charges to which the Chief Electoral Officer for Northern Ireland as the returing officer responsible for the conduct of a parliamentary election in Northern Ireland shall be entitled are, in respect of expenses incurred by him, the amounts specified in the Schedule to these Regulations.

3. The Returning Officer's Expenses (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1984(2) are hereby revoked.

Provided that the maximum amount which a returning officer shall be entitled to charge under this paragraph shall be the total of the sums which he would be entitled to charge for such of the stages of work represented by items (I)(a), (b), (c) and (d) and (II) above as he has carried out, notwithstanding that the amount disbursed by him for any particular stage is greater than the amount specified above as the maximum amount for that stage; provided also that the maximum amount which a returning officer shall be entitled to charge under this paragraph shall be increased by any amount by which the maximum amount which he is entitled to charge under paragraph 4 below exceeds

the amount disbursed by him for the purposes described in that paragraph.

For the employment of persons in connection with the count and the ballot papers of electors entitled to vote by post, and for all clerical and other assistance employed by the returning officer or deputy returning officer for the purposes of the election, including charges for day subsistence expenses and for superannuation contributions where payable—

Provided that the maximum amount which a returning officer shall be entitled to charge under this paragraph shall be increased by any amount by which the maximum amount which he is entitled to charge under paragraph 3 above exceeds the amount disbursed by him for the purposes described in that paragraph.

5. Returning or deputy returning officers' Actual and necessary cost. travelling and overnight subsistence expenses where necessary to make arrangements for the poll or otherwise in connection with the conduct of the election.

6. Travelling and overnight subsistence Actual and necessary cost. expenses of presiding officers and poll clerks (including any expenses incurred in conveying the ballot boxes in those cases in which presiding officers or poll clerks are responsible for the transport of the boxes to or from the polling stations).

7. Travelling and overnight subsistence Actual and necessary cost. expenses of clerical and other assistants employed by the returning officer or deputy returning officer where necessary to make

8. For printing and providing ballot papers.	Actual and necessary cost.

11. For the renting of any building or room for the purpose of the election and for expenses of heating, lighting and cleaning any building or room for such purposes.	Actual and necessary cost.
12. For adapting and fitting up any building or room for the purpose of the election (including the provision of voting compartments and any necessary furniture) and restoring it to fit condition for its normal use.	Actual and necessary cost.
13. For providing ballot boxes, including any repairs.	Actual and necessary cost.
14. For the conveyance of ballot boxes and ballot papers in those cases where the cost of transport is not included in the travelling expenses of presiding officers and poll clerks under paragraph I.6 of this Schedule.	Actual and necessary cost.

II. In an uncontested election for all necessary preliminary work the amount shall be the same as the amount specified for corresponding work in a contested election, except that for all clerical and other assistance employed by the returning officer for the purposes of the election, including charges for day subsistence expenses and for superannuation contributions where payable, the amount shall be not more than one-quarter of the amount specified under paragraph **I.4** of this Schedule.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations revoke and replace the Returning Officers' Expenses (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1984. They prescribe, in relation to Northern Ireland, a revised scale further increasing some of the maximum charges in respect of expenses incurred by the Chief Electoral Officer for Northern Ireland as returning officer for the purposes of or in connection with a parliamentary election. Separate charges are prescribed in respect of the preparation of poll cards by manual and by non-manual means. The increases over those prescribed in 1984 are between 14 per cent and 18¹/₂ per cent save that the maximum charge prescribed for the presiding officer is increased by 30 per cent.
