**The Motor Vehicles (Driving Licences)
(Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 1988**

Made - - - - - *15th June 1988*
Laid before Parliament *24th June 1988*
Coming into force - - - *1st November 1988*

The Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 88(1) and 107 of the Road Traffic Act 1972(1), and now vested in him(2);, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with representative organisations in accordance with section 199 (2) of that Act, and with the approval of the Treasury, hereby makes the following Regulations:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (Driving Licences) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations 1988 and shall come into force on 1st November 1988.
2. The Motor Vehicles (Driving Licences) Regulations 1987 ((3);) shall be amended by substituting for regulation 7 thereof (Fees for licences) the following regulation—

“Fees for licences

7. The fee payable for a licence granted on or after 1st November 1988 shall be, in the case of a licence of a description, and in certain instances granted in particular circumstances, specified in column (1) of the Table in this regulation, the fee specified in relation to that licence in column (2) of that Table.

<p>vehicle which was granted on or after 1st January 1976 not being a licence granted in exchange for a subsisting licence; or</p> <p>(b) before that date held a provisional licence granted on or after 1st October 1982 not being a licence granted in exchange for a subsisting licence; or</p> <p>(c) within the period of 10 years ending on the date of coming into force of the licence, held a licence to drive any class of motor vehicle, not being a licence corresponding to a provisional licence, granted under the law for the time being in force in Northern Ireland.</p>	
<p>2. A licence (not falling within paragraph 1 above or 4 below) granted to a person who, at no time during the period of 10 years ending on the date of coming into force of the licence, has held a licence for any class of vehicle.</p>	£17·00

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Motor Vehicles (Driving Licences) Regulations 1987 by substituting a new regulation 7.

The fee for a first full or provisional licence granted on or after 1st November 1988 is increased from £15 to £17 as is the fee for the grant of a licence (not being a first licence) to a person who has not within ten years held a licence for any class of vehicle (paragraphs 1 and 2 of the Table).

The fees for the grant of a duplicate licence and the grant of a new licence in certain specified circumstances remain unchanged at £5 (paragraphs 3(a) to (c) and 5 of the Table).

A new fee of £5 is introduced for cases where a person re-applies for a licence after the expiration of a period of disqualification (paragraph 3(d) of the Table).

A new provision has been inserted enabling a person who in the previous ten years has held a Northern Ireland driving licence to obtain a licence for a reduced fee of £5 (paragraph 4 of the Table).
