**The Extradition (Internationally Protected Persons) (Amendment) Order 1988**

*Made* - - - - *21st December 1988*  
*Laid before Parliament* *6th January 1989*  
*Coming into force* - - *1st February 1989*

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 21st day of December 1988

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by sections 2, 17 and 21 of the Extradition Act 1870(1) and sections 3(2) and 4(1) of the Internationally Protected Persons Act 1978(2), or otherwise in Her Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Extradition (Internationally Protected Persons) (Amendment) Order 1988 and shall come into force on 1st February 1989.

2. The Extradition (Internationally Protected Persons) Order 1979(3) shall be amended by adding to Part I of Schedule 3 (which names the foreign States with which the United Kingdom has no extradition treaties in force and which are parties to the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of Crimes against Internationally Protected Persons, including Diplomatic Agents, signed at New York on 14th December 1973(4) the following entries —

Syria	25th May 1988
