The National Health Service (General Dental Services) Amendment (No. 3) Regulations 1989

The Secretary of State for Health, in exercise of powers conferred by sections 35(1), 36(1), 126(1) and 128(1) of the National Health Service Act 1977(1) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the National Health Service (General Dental Services) Amendment (No. 3) Regulations 1989 and shall come into force on 1st October 1989.

Amendment of Regulations

2. In regulation 2(1) of the National Health Service (General Dental Services) Regulations 1973(2) (interpretation) in the definition “dental officer” there are substituted for the words “Department of Health and Social Security” the words “Board(3), of the Department of Health”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the National Health Service (General Dental Services) Regulations 1973 which provide for the arrangements under which dentists provide dental services under the National Health Service in England and Wales.

Regulation 2 amends the definition of “dental officer” to include a dental officer employed by the Dental Practice Board.
