**The Company Auditors (Recognition Orders) (Application Fees) Regulations 1990**

The Secretary of State in exercise of his powers under section 45 of the Companies Act 1989<sup>(1)</sup> and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes the following Regulations:

**Citation and commencement**

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Company Auditors (Recognition Orders) (Application Fees) Regulations 1990 and shall come into force on 2nd July 1990.

**2.—(1)** An applicant for a recognition order declaring the applicant to be a recognised supervisory body for the purposes of Part II of the Companies Act 1989 shall pay a fee of £6,500 in respect of its application.

(2) An applicant for a recognition order declaring a qualification offered by it to be a recognised professional qualification for the purposes of Part II of the Companies Act 1989 shall pay a fee of £6,000 in respect of its application.
